BACKGROUND:

Summary (continued)

The approved budget and implementation plan incorporated updates from all of the Community Corrections Partnership Executive Committee (CCPEC) agencies, including anticipated increases to staff for the introduction of additional programming.

In partnership with the CCPEC agencies, other county departments and community organizations, the Probation Department opened the Day Reporting Center (DRC) in Riverside to provide the "One-Stop-Shop" as part of Public Safety Realignment. The goals of the DRC are to reduce recidivism; assist offenders in successful re-entry by providing needed evidence-based services; and increase public safety by holding offenders accountable. These goals are achieved by providing skill-based learning opportunities, cognitive behavioral based counseling, educational and vocation training, and intensive community supervision.

This DRC facility offers a variety of counseling and educational programs through collaboration with the Department of Public Social Services, Riverside County Office of Education, Workforce Development Division of the Economic Development Agency, Mental Health Department, Veterans' Services, Public Health, and Child Support Services. In addition to re-entry programming, this center also provides supportive services such as a Peer Support Specialist to aid in readjusting to a community setting, bus passes, clothing, sack lunches, food and hygiene kits.

With the success of the DRC in Riverside, the Probation Department plans to expand the program with a facility in the Desert area. As approved by the CCPEC on September 10, 2013, the attached Schedule A details the two vans Probation Department wishes to purchase for the DRC and the resolution (Attachment B) details a total of five requested positions to be added to the Probation Department. Of those five, four positions are to fully operate the Desert DRC on an ongoing basis and one position to supplement staffing at the existing DRC in Riverside. All positions are 100% AB109 funded. In accordance with Policy A-30, all positions in the attached resolution will be deleted upon termination of the funding.

FY 2013/14 AB 109 Funding

On July 9, 2013, the CCPEC approved the Probation Department budget request for fiscal year 2013/14 at 100% of the Probation Department's request. The total Riverside County AB 109 allocation is \$51,243,570. The approved Probation Department fiscal year 2013/14 budget allocation is listed below.

The Probation Department will utilize the approved AB 109 funding for on-going costs associated with the continued implementation of AB 109. No additional net county cost will be required and there is no county match requirement. The current fiscal year budget adjustments for the Probation Department are outlined in the attached Schedule A. The Probation Department originally included appropriations of \$13,890,888 in the fiscal year 2013/14 budget associated with the continued implementation of AB 109. The budget adjustment included in the attached Schedule A of \$1,909,112 will bring the total fiscal year 2013/14 AB 109 budget appropriations to the approved amount of \$15,800,000.
