Jim enlisted in the Army Air Corps and at his death was the last surviving member of the 354th Air Service Squadron that served in Tunisia, Pantelleria Island, Naples and the Foggia area air bases.

Jim married his high school sweetheart, Jeanne L. Ellis, to whom he was married for 55 years until her death. He was returned stateside in 1944 for duty at the Miramar Hotel in Santa Monica, California and moonlighted at North American Aviation. After military service was completed, Jim and Jeanne served as officers of the Air Force Association that was formed to halt the rapid disarmament after WWII and to lobby for a separate Department of the Air Force which was established late in 1947. Meanwhile, Jim sold automobiles in Los Angeles and later held managerial positions at several Chevrolet dealerships.

Jim also sold real estate. He and his family moved to Palm Desert where he sold parcels at the Jamaica Sands resort near Bermuda Dunes and later worked at Palm Desert Realty.

John fought in the height of the Great Depression. He jumped freight trains from North Dakota to California at the age of 16. While working in Santa Monica, he graduated from Whittier High School in 1935 and then returned to North Dakota. He co-owned and managed the Sunshine Ranch, 5457 contiguous acres 40 miles east of Bismarck at Steele until 1969. The ranch produced some of the nation's finest purebred Hereford cattle. Mr. Kelsch became one of the early pioneers of the North Dakota oil industry soon after oil was discovered at Tioga in 1951. Along with partner Charles Donlin, he formed Keldon Oil Company which became traded on the NASDAQ Stock Exchange. John was a VIP guest at President Eisenhower's first inauguration in 1953.

John married Katherine Dahl in November 1955. After a six-week honeymoon in South America, they settled in Bismarck to raise their family.

John donated land and a monument for a cemetery to St. Francis Catholic Church at Steele. He supervised work on the grounds during 1960 and dedicated the cemetery in memory of his parents. John always enjoyed life today, never waiting for tomorrow and traveled the world with his wife and children.

On motion of Supervisor Benoit, seconded by Supervisor Stone, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, December 17, 2013, be adjourned in memory of William R. Yancey Sr., a resident of Palm Desert.

Brigadier General William R. Yancey was born in Parkin, Ark., in 1914. He graduated from the University of Arkansas in 1937. He was then appointed a flying cadet, completing his training at Kelly Field, Texas in June 1938, and commissioned a second lieutenant and assigned to active duty. On Pearl Harbor Day he was with the 50th Fighter Group at Meridian, Miss. He later moved to Orlando, Fla. and became the demonstration unit for the Air Force Tactical School. He assumed command of Kissimmee AFB, Fla., and the 349th Night Fighter Squadron in 1943. In 1944, he moved with them to Hammer Field, Calif., and became director of operations and chief of Night Flight Training. In later 1944, he was assigned to China, where he assumed command of the 3rd Fighter Group in North China and remained with them until the end of the war. After the war he and a small number of his 3rd Fighter Group staff officers remained with the Chinese Air Force at U.S.A.F. advisers. He served under Gen. George Marshall, and became Air Attache to Chiang Kai-Shek. Upon his return to the U.S. he was assigned to Andrews AFB and eventually March AFB. It was at March AFB that he was given 20 officers that comprised the group that met at a secret base in Nevada every week to work on a super-secret project: the U-2. After completion of that project he was stationed in London, England, then Dyess AFB Texas where he was promoted to Brigadier General. He continued in the capacity until July 1961. He then moved to Castle AFB in 1961 as Commander, then Roswell, N.M. and then to March AFB. His last assignment was Wright Patterson AFB in Dayton, Ohio. When he retired from the Air Force, he moved to Palm Desert and became the first tournament Director of the Bob Hope Desert Classic for 17 years.
