Background: Community Improvement Designation Funds will be given to the following organizations:

- 1. Riverside County Mexican American Historical Society \$2,000 funding will be used to support the Hometown Hero Student Essay Contest. The contest will take place at Staff Sergeant Ysmael R. Villegas Middle School to commemorate the 90th birthday celebration of the late Medal of Honor recipient, Ysmael R.Villegas. Students in all grade levels will get a chance to participate in this contest for a chance to win a computer, ipad/tablet and gift cards. A few lucky students will be selected to read their essay at the special Hometown Hero event on March 15, 2014 at the Riverside National Cemetery.
- 2. West Coast Thunder-\$500 funds will go directly to benefit the Riverside National Cemetery Support Committee to help fund the Cemetery projects including the purchasing of flower cones and the honor of placing flowers and an American flag on the final resting place for indigent and unaccompanied, homeless Veterans buried each month at our Riverside National Cemetery.
- 3. Martin Luther King High School-\$1,500 funds will be used to support the Annual King High Remembers event that will be held on March 21, 2014. King High Remembers is a military Veterans Oral History Project. In 2013, over 300 veterans came to share their stories with over 700 11th grade US History Students. Lunch will be provided for all of the veterans.
- 4. Riverside Transit Agency-\$300 this item was originally presented at the October 28th Board Meeting. However after the check was mailed to the organization, they were unable to cash it since the check was made out to Western Riverside County Transportation NOW and needs to be made out to Riverside Transit Agency. The check has since been returned; therefore we are adding it on this agenda with the correct payee.
