BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Transportation Department is recommending that maintenance be terminated on Skyline Drive from the Orange-Riverside Counties boundary line to the city limits of the City of Corona, approximately 24,710 feet, or 4.68 miles in length. Skyline Drive is an isolated road that is not contiguous to any county maintained road, and is not a commuter thoroughfare. Skyline Drive is a narrow, circuitous dirt road with many blind curves and steep up and down segments that are difficult to navigate by conventional motor vehicles. The road does not provide primary access to any occupied properties, and traffic on the road is intermittent and of low volume and is controlled by a gate. The Transportation Department finds Skyline Drive unnecessary for the public convenience as a transportation route and requests that maintenance be terminated.

There is a trailhead approximately one mile from the gate. Past that point, the road essentially functions as roughly a four-mile-long cul-de-sac, providing access to cell tower installations in Orange County and as a trail for hikers and bicyclists on U.S. Forest Service land. It is the Transportation Department's opinion that the responsibility of future maintenance of Skyline Drive should fall to the U.S. Forest Service to operate the road as they deem appropriate.

An unsigned copy of an agreement dated December 13, 1926, by and between the Board of Supervisors (Board) of Riverside County (County), California, and the District Forester, Forest Service, (District 5), United States Department of Agriculture, under and pursuant to the provisions of Section 23 of the Act of November 9, 1921 (Public No. 87), known as the Federal Highway Act, purportedly covered the construction of a road, referenced as Corona-Black Star Canyon Road, from the east forest boundary to the County's west boundary line, and the County agreed to assume maintenance of the constructed road commencing January 1, 1928. This 1926 Agreement did not contain a term period.

On February 24, 1948, the Board approved a resolution that adopted a primary system of County Roads of the County of Riverside and a map that established the Maintained County Road System (the "1948 Road Book"). Skyline Drive was included within the 1948 Road Book under the designation of "other county maintained roads."

On December 12, 1978, the County and the U.S. Forest Service entered into that certain Forest Development Road Cooperative Agreement, whereby the parties agreed to work cooperatively to develop and maintain forest roads, subject to the availability of funds, and identified Skyline Drive as Forest Road No. 4S01. The U.S. Forest Service has communicated to the Transportation Department a desire for a forest road to provide access to the Cleveland National Forest and to serve a federal interest. This 1978 Agreement could be terminated by either party upon 90 days advance notice. Notwithstanding these agreements with the U.S. Forest Service, the County had always maintained its discretionary powers to supervise, manage, and control any of its rights-of-way under the law.

In 1982, Orange County closed the portion of Skyline Drive within its jurisdiction, named "Black Star Canyon Road," with a locked gate and barricade after repeated concerns for public safety, high fire hazards, and road failures due to storm damage. On May 27, 1987, the Orange County Board of Supervisors terminated maintenance of Black Star Canyon Road by Resolution No. 87-732.

On February 25, 1986, the Board adopted Resolution No. 86-04, which restricted the use of Skyline Drive from the Orange-Riverside Counties boundary line to the city limits of the City of Corona. The Board determined that it was necessary for the safety of the traveling public to close and restrict the use of Skyline Drive. According to the Resolution, tragic accidents resulting in fatal and seriously disabling injuries were occurring on a regular and chronic basis to vehicle users of Skyline Drive prior to that time. Attempts to post Skyline Drive

with signs and devices warning of the dangers were unsuccessful, as they were being vandalized due to destruction and theft, and funding was not available to substantially improve the road. A gate with a locking mechanism was placed at the southwest boundary of the City of Corona city limits to restrict use of the road to those with a pass key. Pass keys were issued to police, fire, emergency, public utilities, governmental agencies, persons owning or leasing property between the gate and the Orange-Riverside Counties boundary line, and those deemed to have an appropriate need as determined by the Road Commissioner (now the Director of Transportation and Land Management).

It has been the Transportation Department's position that the road is not safe for unrestricted public access, and opening it for unrestricted access would create a liability for the County and a situation where vehicles compete with hikers and bicyclists for limited space on a very narrow winding road. Since this road functions as an access road for the U. S. Forest Service's land, it is the Transportation Department's position that the U.S. Forest Service should be responsible for the operations, maintenance, and liability associated with the road, in concert with other users that own parcels accessed by the road.

The Transportation Department staff conducted a review of the above-referenced project and has determined that the termination of maintenance of Skyline Drive is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15301. The proposed project is termination of maintenance of an existing road by the County and such maintenance and management would be conducted by the U.S. Forest Service. Also, there is no expansion of use or alterations, which will occur beyond that existing at the time of this determination.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

The termination of maintenance of Skyline Drive would not impact the ability of citizens or businesses to access the area. Access would be managed by the U.S. Forest Service.

SUPPLEMENTAL:

Additional Fiscal Information

A review of the maintenance cost for the last five years shows that the Transportation Department will see a realized maintenance cost savings for the road and gate of approximately \$10,000 annually.

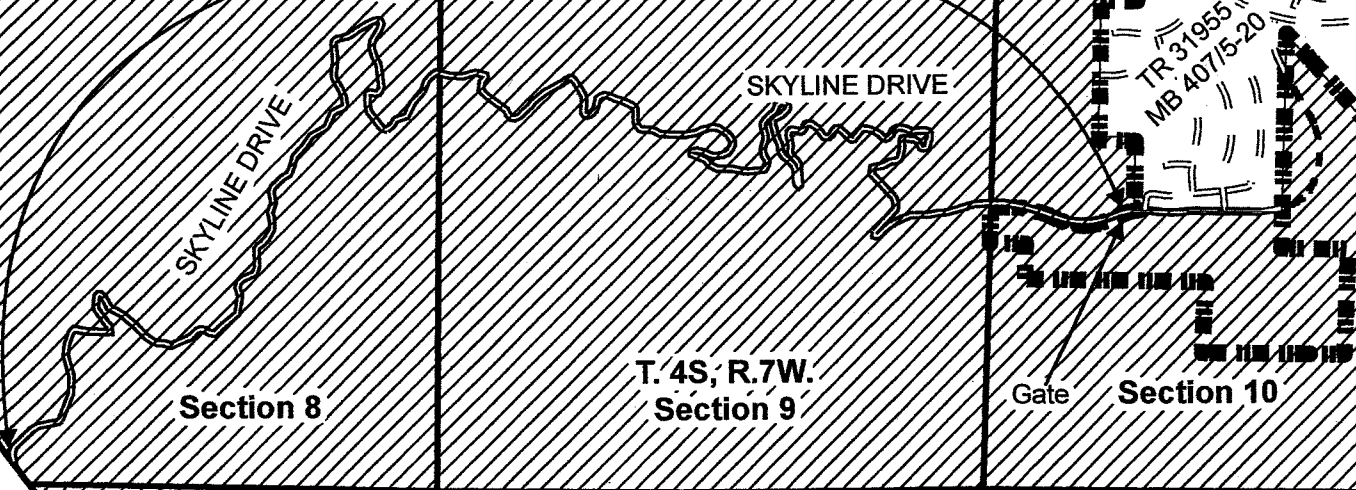

Recommendation

That the Board of Supervisors, prior to authorizing the termination of the county's maintenance of this portion of Skyline Drive, confirm that the United States Forest Service ("Forest Service") will indeed maintain the subject roadway in a manner that continues to facilitate critically needed vehicular access to users of the wireless communications facilities located on Santiago Peak and the surrounding areas accessed via Skyline Drive.

Skyline Drive provides access to critically needed wireless infrastructure

The 4.68 miles of Skyline Drive, from the city limits of Corona westerly to the area of the county boundary where termination of maintenance is being considered, is the first link in the critically needed vehicular road access to numerous wireless telecommunication tower sites located on Santiago Peak and the surrounding area.

Crown Castle ("Crown") owns and manages two of these telecommunications sites—the "Santiago Peak" site and the "Santa Ana" site. These two telecommunication towers, located in close proximity to one another, provide the wireless infrastructure upon which several dozen wireless tenants are located and broadcast their signals.

Crown's tenants include but are not limited to: one (1) city; three (3) school districts; two (2) major, local television stations; one (1) major cable operator; and, three (3) federal, law enforcement agencies. It is imperative that adequate and reliable vehicular access to these sites, for maintenance and operations, be maintained.

Simply by viewing aerial mapping of the Santiago Peak area, it is apparent that Crown is not the only provider of wireless infrastructure in the surrounding area. There are numerous, other telecommunication

tower sites scattered all over this area of Santiago Peak and they all rely on the use of Skyline Drive for vehicle access for both routine and emergency service and repairs.

The Board's proposed action does not guarantee ongoing maintenance

The Board report dated December 24, 2013, prepared by the county's Transportation Department, finds "...Skyline Drive unnecessary for the public convenience as a transportation route and requests that maintenance be terminated." Crown disagrees. On the contrary, Crown would argue that ongoing maintenance of Skyline Drive is critical to the public's convenience for the simple reason that vehicular access to the numerous telecommunication towers and the operators they serve cannot be comprised. Failure to assure ongoing safe and reliable vehicular access over and across Skyline Drive to Santiago Peak could potentially threaten public safety due to wireless operator's access to their equipment being compromised.

While the Board report states that the Forest Service has a "desire for a forest road to provide access to the Cleveland National Forest", this desire does not necessarily imply that the Forest Service will adequately maintain this roadway for vehicular use. Further, the Board report states that "the Forest Service should be responsible for the operations, maintenance, and liability associated with the road" and that "...access will be maintained" by the Forest Service, nowhere in the Board report does the Transportation Department confirm that the Forest Service has agreed to this new arrangement and if so, what level of service and maintenance by the Forest Service should be expected.

Summary


Transportation's report to the Board indicates that the county will save \$10,000 annually if the maintenance of Skyline Drive is terminated. This minimal savings, in the context of the potential to threaten vehicular access to critically needed wireless telecommunications infrastructure and equipment, should be an unacceptable risk. This risk can only be mitigated should the Forest Service commit to maintaining this portion of Skyline Drive in a manner that facilitates safe, vehicular access.

The Board should not terminate this roadway's maintenance unless and until the Forest Service makes this commitment in a manner acceptable to the Board.

Dear Mr. Perez:

We have received the County's letter dated November 27, 2013 identifying the County's desire to terminate maintenance on Skyline Drive, in Corona, CA. The Cleveland National Forest objects to this proposal.

We clearly stated our objections to this idea in our meeting with the County on June 17, 2013. Additionally, we had previously objected to this idea on August 17, 2009 in our letter to Alejandro Martinez, Senior Engineering Technician. At that time, you sent an e-mail to the Forest Service stating "We certainly are not interested in pursuing an action that would diminish your agency's ability to use the road for access". Terminating maintenance will most certainly diminish our ability to use the road for access and will significantly impair our ability to fulfill our obligations and mission in this geographic area.

The Forest Service and the County of Riverside entered into a Cooperative Agreement in 1926 in order to secure rights-of-way and construct Skyline Road under the Federal Highway Act. Based on the conditions of that agreement, and a subsequent Cooperative Agreement signed in 1979, the County has maintained this road for 85-years, since January 1, 1928. This route crosses parcels of private land as well as National Forest System lands. Skyline Drive provides access for the public to their National Forest. The Forest Service uses Skyline Drive for access to conduct forest health projects, ecosystem protection, recreation management, and hazardous vegetation management activities adjacent to Riverside County's ever growing communities. Critical access for emergency services such as fire suppression and emergency medical response (Riverside County Fire Department) and law enforcement (Riverside County Sheriff) is provided. The road serves utility companies and numerous commercial communications site users, in addition to many governmental and public safety organizations that serve as emergency responders, or provide 911 emergency support. Skyline Drive has also been used by the Riverside County Transportation Commission's Irvine-Corona Expressway geotechnical exploratory drilling consultants.

Skyline Drive's role was critical in the suppression and post fire burned area rehabilitation and resource protection for the Sierra (2006) and Santiago Fires (2007). As further development occurs adjacent to the National Forest wildlands, its role will not diminish, rather it will be of greater importance to facilitate rapid suppression of fires near the wildland urban interface.

Rights-of-way

Based on the 1926 Cooperative Agreement, the County is responsible "To secure necessary rights-of-way without expense directly or indirectly to the United States". Additionally the County holds the historic rights-of-way through the private parcels and possibly through the federal parcels. The Forest Service does not have the budget or capacity to take on the maintenance responsibility for Skyline Drive, nor do we have the authority or rights-of-way to take this on.

It is our concern that if the County terminates maintenance, then neither party will be able to spend funds on the road maintenance needs, even to repair watershed and habitat damage. If terminated, Emergency Relief for Federally Owned Roads (ERFO) funding from the Federal Highway Administration will not be available to either party. In the 1979 Cooperative Agreement, the County agreed to clause 1.f. which states "Provide for appropriate jurisdictional status of roads through transfer of easements and acquisition of easements by the appropriate party". This has not occurred. Currently, the County is the only entity with full authority and responsibility to maintain the entire length of this road.

According to the data available, the 2013/2014 County of Riverside budget is \$4.7 billion. Public Ways are funded for \$209.0 million and Transportation for \$171.0 million. The County has estimated their annual maintenance cost of Skyline Drive at approximately \$10,000 per year. This equals 0.00006% of the County's Transportation budget, or 6 thousandths of a percent.

Access and Use

In 1986, through County Board resolution No. 86-04, the County restricted motorized access to Skyline Drive. In 1987, through a recommended motion made by LeRoy Smoot (Road Commissioner and County Surveyor), the Board of Supervisors approved the issuance of both short and long term public use of the road. In particular the County stated in their March 2, 1987 letter that "Road Department keys are also available to the general public by completing a similar form and posting a refundable deposit of \$50.00 for short term use or \$100.00 for long term use".

The letter that we received from the County, dated November 27, 2013 states that "Skyline Drive has limited use due to the installation of a locked gate in 1986 that limits access at the Corona City limits". We believe this to be an inaccurate statement. One of the primary reasons that the County gave for replacing the historic lock on the Skyline gate was that too many people had been issued keys over the past 25-years, and that too many people had access; the number was estimated in the 5,000 - 10,000 key range. This is not commensurate with limited road use. Since the County replaced the old lock on January 2, 2013, and is no longer issuing keys to the general public, use has become limited because of the County's action, which stood directly in opposition to the position and recommendation of the Forest Service.

We urge the County to allow public access for a long enough duration of time so that accurate traffic count data can be gathered to empirically measure road use. Through the Cooperative Agreement of 1979, the County acknowledged that traffic carried by Skyline Drive is County responsibility. This is identified in clause 1.a. which states "Agree that certain roads under the

jurisdiction of the cooperator [County of Riverside] or the Forest Service which serve the National Forest and also carry traffic which is properly the responsibility of the cooperator [County of Riverside] should be maintained and, if necessary, improved, to a standard adequate to accommodate safely and economically all traffic which uses such roads".

Agreement Language

Finally, based on the 1979 cooperative agreement, the County cannot terminate that agreement without making full settlement to the Forest Service. The agreement states in clause 7.b. "This agreement may be terminated by either party upon at least 90-days prior written notice, except that such termination shall in no way affect or change any commitment made authorizing the use of roads or rights-of-way for purposes for which Federal funds were expended, or any operation in progress at time of notice and provided, that such termination shall in no way affect the agreement of the parties hereto with respect to any obligations incurred under the agreement until a full settlement has been made." Clearly if the County abandons this agreement and terminates road maintenance, there will be an effect and a change to the commitment made authorizing the use of roads and rights-of-way for which Federal funds were expended.


Considering that the County was an initiating agency in the original construction of Skyline Road and agreed to the maintenance responsibility; acknowledging that the motorized public has had access to Skyline Drive for 85-years; the fact that a multitude of tax paying businesses and private property owners, government and quasi-government agencies, and emergency communications and response providers depend on this road; and recognizing that Skyline Road provides critical administrative access to the U.S. Forest Service, it is our opinion that it would not be prudent, responsible, or justifiable for the County of Riverside to simply terminate maintenance of this road without having a solid plan for transitioning maintenance to another willing party. We see no benefit to any private property owner, business, government agency, or the public from the County's proposed action.

At this point, it has not been made clear why the County desires to terminate maintenance of this road. We have been given various explanations ranging from liability, to budgetary constraints, to lack of need. The Forest Service would benefit from clearly understanding the reason(s) that the County proposes termination of Skyline Drive's road maintenance responsibilities.

We formally request that the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors rejects the proposal to terminate maintenance of Skyline Drive in order to provide for continued public protection, access and safety of Riverside County communities.

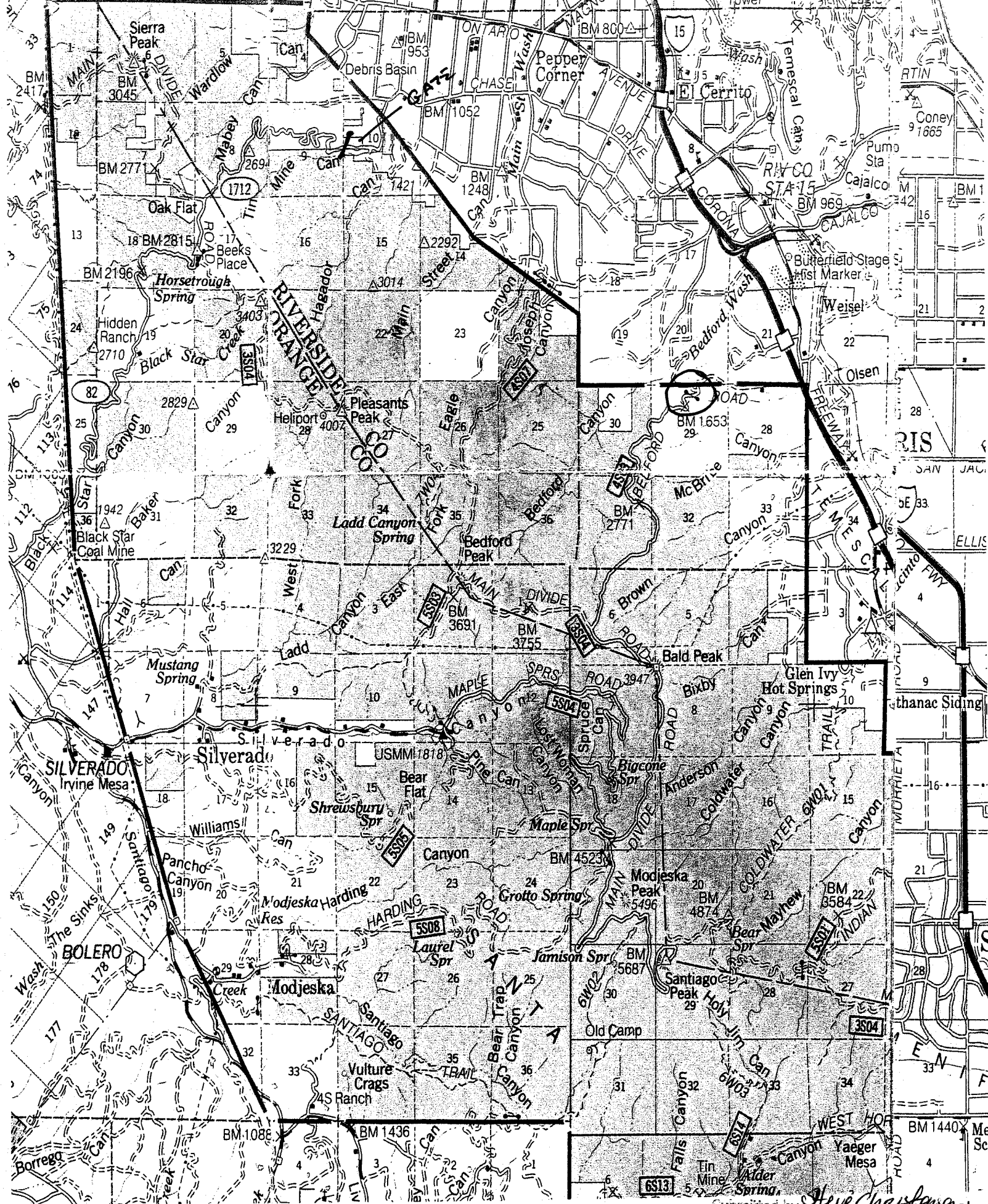

Verizon Wireless would like to formally state for the record its position regarding proposed Resolution 2014-029, Authorization to Terminate the Maintenance of Skyline Drive from the Corona City limits westerly to the Orange-Riverside Counties boundary line. As you may know, Verizon Wireless currently holds a twenty year lease with the U.S. Forest Service at our Sierra Peak site in the Cleveland National Forest. Verizon Wireless accesses this site via Skyline Drive and therefore has concerns over proposed termination of maintenance and is hereby requesting that this item be tabled.


After review of the 1997 Lease Agreement between Verizon Wireless and the U.S. Forest Service, the 1978 Cooperative Agreement between the U.S. Forest Service and the County of Riverside, and the 1926 Cooperative Agreement between the U.S. Forest Service and the County of Riverside, Verizon would respectfully request that any immediate termination of maintenance be postponed until a settlement can be reached between the U.S. Forest Service and the County of Riverside. This position was reached based on the following:

- The 1978 Cooperative Agreement between the U.S. Forest Service and the County of Riverside states that "This agreement may be terminated by either party upon at least 90 days prior written notice, except that such termination shall in no way affect or change any commitment made authorizing the use of the roads or rights-of-way for purposes for which federal funds were expended, or any operation in progress at time of notice and provided, that such termination shall in no way affect the agreement of the parties hereto with respect to any obligations incurred under the agreement until a full settlement has been made." The allocation of federal funds for Skyline Drive is documented in both the 1926 and the 1978 agreements.
- Verizon Wireless entered into a Lease Agreement with the U.S. Forest Service in 1997 for the Sierra Peak Site, this agreement was entered into with the understanding that a maintenance agreement was in place for Skyline Drive and access to the site would be granted without additional cost.
- Therefore, it is the position of Verizon Wireless that if termination of maintenance is to occur it must be done via a settlement between the U.S. Forest Service and the County of Riverside and unilateral abandonment maintenance is not acceptable under the current agreement. Verizon Wireless is further of the opinion that input from stakeholders, including telecommunication carriers, should be taken should a settlement discussion take place.

My name is Larry D. Boothe. I own 80 acres of which 14.5 acres are in Riverside County at the top of Skyline Drive. I have been going to this area since 1960, some 54 years. As you know there is one way in and one way out because of Orange County reluctance to maintain Black Star Canyon Road. I pay taxes on both gas and property to your County. The maintenance of this road is the only benefit I receive from my taxes and is crucial in getting to my property. As a matter of fact, it is the only way to my property. It is the shortest and best way to access this area of the Santa Ana Mountains. Your road department has done a superb job in grading this road after all, this is a County road. Depending on the rainfall, the County usually blades the road once a year. What is the actual cost of blading Skyline Drive? I believe the person that determined the cost to be \$10,000 a year, is mistaken and that figure is very misleading. I believe a blade and operator costs about \$1,000.00 a day, times 2 days is \$2,000.00, not \$10,000.

The Counties description of the road is very misleading also. I have owned several conventional vehicles that I have used over the years on Skyline Drive. I currently drive a Ford pickup and I pull a 20' Fifth Wheel Flat Bed trailer so to say conventional vehicles couldn't handle this road is totally false.

I understand what the county is trying to do, get rid of liability. Because of a very foolish 16 year old in the 1980s' driving off the road and becoming a paraplegic. Latter his parents sued the county for millions. Since that lawsuit, I haven't heard nor was I ever told of another lawsuit levied against the County regarding Skyline Drive.

It seems the County wants the U. S. Forestry Department to take over the maintenance of Skyline, God forbid. The Main Divide Road is perfect example of the Forestry Road maintenance. It has not been maintained for several years and is in deplorable condition. I don't want this to happen to Skyline.

As far as the Skyline Gate goes leaving it under Forestry control, will result in the gate being left open all the time which same as saying to the vandals, "Welcome back, and do as you wish!" I am sure the homeowners will be just tickled pink when they find out the gate will be opened all the time. I understand the gate has become a real nuisance to the adjacent homeowners. This road was there before this housing track was even a thought. I think their main complaint was about the drunken young people at the gate in the middle of the night, the parking in front of their houses and leaving the gate open which created a vandal fest. All of these issues have been addressed and resolved! The traffic has decreased significantly when you changed the lock on the Gate which in turn has decreased the vandalism.

I was at the first "Town Hall Meeting in the Road" in the 1980's were Mr. Smoot talked about County putting up a gate on Skyline. I am the person that distributes the keys for the Land Owner Lock on the gate. The County of Riverside made us go to the expense of hiring an attorney to draw up a "Key Agreement". Why did you make us go to this expense of making a now worthless agreement, if you always knew you were going to Terminate Maintenance? The key agreement was supposed to protect the County, as well as the landowners. This has become a slap in our faces!

There are some 40 Electronic users on Sierra and Pleasant Peak. I believe your County is one of them and so is The BNSF Railroad, The FAA, The FBI, The Metro Water Dept., LA County Sheriff, Orange County Sheriff, Verizon, A.T.T. and The US Government (Doppler radar) are just a few other users; they all use Skyline Drive. I don't think they will be very happy when they find out about your Resolution!

You're kidding me, after some 87 years, you are wanting to Terminating Maintenance. The County, accepted maintenance of the road in 1926 and it has been on the County Maps since 1948. **I do have one question for you, does this mean you are getting rid of Maintenance on all your County Roads or are we just the lucky ones? What you are doing is just wrong!**

I had a 2100 sq. foot home that I owned up on Skyline. I had to remove the house because of the vandals removing the interior walls allowing the roof to fall in on itself. I ended up taking it off the mountain because it became a safety hazard. **So will Skyline Drive become a safety hazard if you Terminate Maintenance!** I have spent approx. \$35,000.00 repairing the damage done to my property by four wheelers and vandals destroying the house.







BACKGROUND:

Summary

The Transportation Department is recommending that maintenance be terminated on Skyline Drive from the Orange-Riverside Counties Boundary line to the City limits of the City of Corona, approximately 24,710 feet, or 4.68 miles in length. Skyline Drive is an isolated road that is not contiguous to any county maintained road, and is not a commuter thoroughfare. Skyline Drive is a narrow, circuitous dirt road, with many blind curves and steep up and down segments, that is difficult to navigate by conventional motor vehicles. The road does not provide primary access to any occupied properties, and traffic on the road is intermittent and of low volume, and is controlled by a gate. The Transportation Department finds Skyline Drive unnecessary for the public convenience as a transportation route and requests that maintenance be terminated.

There is a trail head approximately one mile from the gate. Past that point, the road essentially functions as about a four mile long cul-de-sac providing access to cell tower installations in Orange County, and as a trail for hikers and bicyclists on U.S. Forest Service land. It is the Transportation Department's opinion that the responsibility of future maintenance of Skyline Drive should fall to the U. S. Forest Service and/or the owners of the cell tower property, for them to operate the road as they deem appropriate.

An unsigned copy of an agreement dated December 13, 1926 by and between the Board of Supervisors of Riverside County, California, and the District Forester, Forest Service, (District 5), United States Department of Agriculture, under and pursuant to the provisions of Section 23 of the Act of November 9, 1921 (Public No. 87), known as the Federal Highway Act, purportedly covered the construction of a road, referenced as Corona-Black Star Canyon Road, from the east forest boundary to Riverside County's west boundary line, and the County agreed to assume maintenance of the constructed road commencing January 1, 1928. This 1926 Agreement did not contain a term period.

On February 24, 1948, the Board of Supervisors for the County of Riverside adopted a Resolution that adopted a primary system of County Roads of the County of Riverside and a map that established the Maintained County Road System (the "1948 Road Book"). Skyline Drive was included within the 1948 Road Book under the designation of "other county maintained roads".

On December 12, 1978, the County and the Forest Service entered into that certain Forest Development Road Cooperative Agreement whereby the parties agreed to work cooperatively to develop and maintain forest roads, subject to the availability of funds, and identified Skyline Drive as Forest Road No. 4S01. The Forest Service has communicated to the Transportation Department a desire for a forest road to provide access to the Cleveland National Forest and to serve a federal interest. This 1978 Agreement could be terminated by either party upon a 90 days advance notice. Notwithstanding these agreements with the Forest Service, the County had always maintained its discretionary powers to supervise, manage and control any of its rights-of-way under the law.

In 1982, Orange County closed the portion of Skyline Drive within its jurisdiction, named "Black Star Canyon Road", with a massive gate and barricade after repeated concerns for public safety, high fire hazards, and road failures due to storm damage. On May 27, 1987, the Orange County Board of Supervisors terminated maintenance of Black Star Canyon Road by Resolution No. 87-732.

On February 25, 1986, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 86-04 which restricted the use of Skyline Drive from the Orange-Riverside Counties Boundary line to the City Limits of the City of Corona. The Board determined that it was necessary for the safety of the traveling public to close and restrict the use of Skyline Drive. According to the Resolution, tragic accidents resulting in fatal and seriously disabling injuries were occurring on a regular and chronic basis to vehicle users of Skyline Drive prior to that time. Attempts to post Skyline Drive with signs and devices warning of the dangers were unsuccessful as they were being vandalized due to destruction and theft, and funding was not available to substantially improve the road. A gate with a locking mechanism was placed at the southwest boundary of the City of Corona City limits to restrict use of the road to those with a pass key. Pass keys were issued to police, fire, emergency, public utilities, governmental agencies, persons owning or leasing property between the gate and the Orange-Riverside Counties Boundary line and those deemed to have an appropriate need as determined by the Road Commissioner (now the Director of Transportation and Land Management).

About a year ago the Transportation Department was contacted by representatives from the Homeowner's Association adjacent to the gate, in the City of Corona, requesting that the County more closely manage the issuance of keys. The gate was being left open frequently and traffic was increasing, particularly at night. The Department conducted an assessment of our key issuance and found that over 1,000 keys had been issued over the years, essentially upon request. We then changed the locks on the gate and restricted key issuance to property owners, Forest Service, and emergency service providers. We have been approached by members of the public that would like for the County to continue to issue keys upon request. However, it is the Department's position that the road is not safe for unrestricted public access, and opening it for unrestricted access would create a liability for the County, and a situation where vehicles compete with hikers and bicyclists for limited space on a very narrow winding road. Since this road really functions as an access road to U. S. Forest Service land, it is the Department's position that the Forest Service should be responsible for the operations, maintenance, and liability associated with road, in concert with other users that own parcels accessed by the road.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

The termination of maintenance of Skyline Drive would not impact the ability of citizens or businesses to access the area. Access would be managed by the U.S. Forest Service.

SUPPLEMENTAL:

Additional Fiscal Information

A review of the maintenance cost for the last five years shows that the Transportation Department will see a realized maintenance cost savings for the road and gate of approximately \$10,000.00 annually.



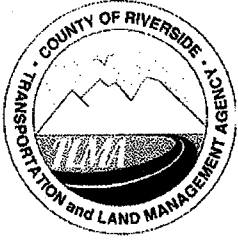

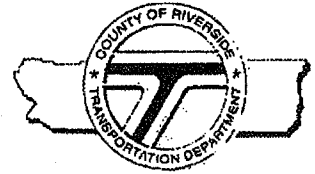

RESTRICTING THE USE OF SKYLINE DRIVE FROM
THE ORANGE COUNTY BOUNDARY TO
THE CITY LIMITS OF CORONA
(First Supervisorial District)

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside may close or restrict the use of a county highway to protect the public pursuant to Section 942.5 of the Streets and Highways Code; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing on a Resolution of Intention to Permanently Restrict Access and to Terminate Maintenance of Skyline Drive was held by the Board at its regular session on January 14, 1986, at 1:30 P.M., at which time oral and written testimony from interested persons on the proposal to restrict access and terminate maintenance was received, evaluated and considered; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, FOUND AND DETERMINED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session assembled on February 25, 1986, as follows:

1. Skyline Drive is a narrow, circuitous, mountain dirt road with numerous blind curves and many steep up and downhill segments.
2. Motor vehicle operators traversing Skyline Drive must exert maximum attention and alertness, and must have a driving skill not found with typical drivers.
3. Tragic accidents resulting in fatal and seriously disabling injuries occur on a regular and chronic basis to motor vehicle users of Skyline Drive.

1 4. The majority of the serious accidents occurring on
2 Skyline Drive are the result of errors in judgment by motor
3 vehicle drivers which occur because they are unable to apply the
4 skill necessary to negotiate Skyline Drive.

5 5. There is no funding currently available to the
6 County to substantially improve Skyline Drive.

7 6. Attempts to post Skyline Drive with signs and
8 devices warning of the dangers are constantly frustrated by
9 vandalism including, but not limited to, destruction and theft of
10 the warning signs and devices.

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, FOUND, DETERMINED AND ORDERED by
12 the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, pursuant to
13 Section 942.5 of the Streets and Highways Code, that it is
14 necessary, for the safety of the traveling public, to close and
15 restrict the use of Skyline Drive from the city limits of the
16 City of Corona to the Orange County Boundary in order to provide
17 for the protection of the public.
