**BACKGROUND:** Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

- 1. RCRMC Foundation \$1,500 funding will be used to support the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Sexual Assault Response Team (SART)/Riverside County Child Assessment Team (RCCAT) Conference. The goal of the conference is to raise community awareness of the growing epidemic of abuse and the services offered by the County. Attendees will include physicians, nurses, social workers, law enforcement, advocates, prosecutors, and others. 200 attendees are expected to attend.
- 2. Concert for Heroes -\$ 2,500 funding will be used to support this year's Concert for Heroes, a symphonic concert held at the Riverside National Cemetery. Proceeds will benefit the Riverside National Cemetery. Over 10,000 participants are expected to attend.
- 3. Latino Network-Youth Leadership Committee/HOPE-\$1,000 funding will be used to send girls from North, Poly, Ramona, Arlington, Lincoln and Norte Vista High School to the HOPE Latina History Day Conference as well as take part in follow-up sessions at their schools. The purpose of this program is to educate and motivate Latinas to be self-sufficient so that they can obtain economic and political parity through a college education.
- 4. Project Food- \$2,500 funding will be used to support the Riverside Student Run Health Clinic, a bi-monthly volunteer run clinic at the First Congregational Church in Riverside. Volunteers consist of students from Loma Linda University and University of California, Riverside who are studying to become physicians, dentists, pharmacists and registered nurses. At least 60 patients receive medical assistance, 14 receive dental assistance and 10 receive mental health assistance every time the clinic is in operation.
