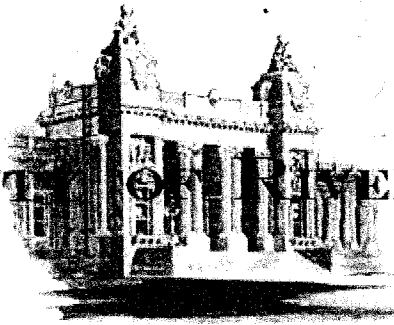

Dear Chairman Strong:

Riverside County is pleased to support the California Intercity Passenger Rail Program and the continued expansion of intercity rail service to the Banning Pass-Coachella Valley.

California has established a proud tradition of investing in intercity rail to the tune of \$2.3 billion since 1990 for infrastructure, equipment, and operations. With this investment, California's three existing corridors – the Capitol Corridor, San Joaquin, and Los Angeles-San Diego (LOSSAN) – have become among the top performing Amtrak routes in the United States. In 2012 alone, more than 5.5 million riders boarded intercity trains in California, accounting for more than 20 percent of the nation's total.

This success can and must be continued. Extending intercity service to the Coachella Valley will strengthen our state's transportation system and economy. The Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) is partnering with Caltrans to build the service development plan and update the State Rail Plan for a new Banning Pass-Coachella Valley route. We strongly support completion of these plans and further efforts to identify state and federal funding for the new service.

California's existing intercity passenger rail program has proven to generate good jobs, save time for passenger and motorists, reduce emissions, and promote private investment in sustainable communities. Banning Pass-Coachella Valley service will do all of the above and more. Riverside County continues to be one of California's fastest growing regions, and a more attractive place for jobs and private investment.

8 **WHEREAS**, California's intercity passenger rail program has three existing rail routes
9 that serve more than 5.5 million riders a year. These services generate good jobs, save time for
10 passenger and motorists, reduce emissions, and promote private investment in sustainable
11 communities; and

13 **WHEREAS**, new regional intercity passenger rail service from Los Angeles to the
14 Coachella Valley will ease congestion on local roads and freeways, providing new economic
15 opportunity, improving mobility, and the quality of life in the Inland Empire; and

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17 **WHEREAS**, Amtrak currently runs the Sunset Limited train three days a week with
18 service between Los Angeles and Coachella Valley in Riverside County at inconvenient
19 schedules; and

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21 **WHEREAS**, there are limited public transit options exist between Coachella Valley, Los
22 Angeles, and other locations in the Inland Empire; and

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24 **WHEREAS**, all local cities would benefit from the expanded travel options that would
25 come from this new passenger rail service; and

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27 **WHEREAS**, the need for daily convenient intercity passenger rail service is growing as
28 an environmental friendly alternate to the Interstate 10 and other congested corridors; and

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WHEREAS, the Inland Empire, Coachella Valley, and the Banning Pass Area are experiencing rapid population growth and demand on this route will continue to increase; and

WHEREAS, there is strong local support to establish new intercity rail passenger service in the Coachella Valley and the Banning Pass Area; and

WHEREAS, Riverside County Transportation Commission and the Coachella Valley Association of Governments have initiated project development and planning for this new corridor; and


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the county of Riverside does hereby support the California Intercity Rail Program and continued expansion of Intercity Rail Service from Los Angeles to the Banning Pass-Coachella Valley region.
