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BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

- 1. Fair Housing Council of Riverside County, Inc-\$500** funding will be used to support the 2014 Housing Conference. This conference will bring together decision-makers in order to solve Fair Housing issues in Riverside County. Topics to be discussed will be: Historical Perspective of the Fair Housing Act, Legislative Actions to Enforce the Fair Housing Act, Nation's Best and Worst Fair Housing Practices and Policies, Victim's Perspectives on Housing Discrimination and the Future of Fair Housing.

- 2. Community Settlement Association-\$1,000** funding will be used to help replace the roof at Community Settlement Association's main building on Bermuda Avenue. The goal is to completely remove the two existing roofs, build a new roofing structure, and then apply the final roofing material. Habitat for Humanity has agreed to paint the interior of the building once the roof is completed. Community Settlement Association also plans to contact parents of their afterschool program and others to help revitalize the building and grounds.
