On motion of Supervisor Benoit, seconded by Supervisor Stone, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, March 11, 2014, be adjourned in memory of Frank Gayle Andrews, a 70-year-old resident of San Clemente and former resident of Coachella Valley who retired from the Riverside County Sheriff's Department as a Chief Deputy after 32 years of honorable service.

Born March 1, 1944 in Whittier, California, Frank served his Country as a Peace Officer and joined the Riverside County Sheriff Department at the age of 21 on July 5, 1965. Starting his career as a Patrol Deputy assigned to the Riverside Station, he was promoted to Investigator in 1969 and assigned to the Vice and Narcotics Unit out of the Riverside Station. He was the first sworn officer in the department to work in an undercover capacity purchasing illegal drugs and narcotics directly from the dealers.

In 1975, he was promoted to Sergeant at the Indio Station, where he served as Watch Commander and supervised the Indio Station Investigation Unit. He was promoted to Lieutenant in 1980 and placed in charge of the Sheriff's countywide Vice and Narcotic Unit with Investigators working out of the Riverside and Indio Stations. He planned, initiated, and executed the Sheriff's first major countywide marijuana cultivation eradication program involving over 100 officers, fixed wing aircraft, and helicopters.

Transferring back to Indio as the Indio Jail Commander, Frank helped plan and develop the blue prints for the Indio Jail expansion. Promoted to Captain and moved back to Riverside, he served as the Commander of the Riverside Jail and placed in charge of building the Robert Presley Detention Center in Downtown Riverside. In 1989, he promoted to Chief Deputy and served the remainder of his career as Chief of Desert Operations managing the Sheriff's Banning, Hemet, Palm Desert, Indio, and Blythe Stations.

Retiring in December 1997, Frank moved from Coachella Valley to San Clemente where he enjoyed sailing with his wife Julie. He was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather, brother, and friend whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed.

Larry was DAPCAN's volunteer co-editor for several years and a frequent contributor to HEP C News. He also published one book, authored three yet to be published books, wrote a HEP C blog, and wrote many articles for HIV and HEP C publications. He also made several live media appearances to report on living with HIV/AIDS and HEP C.

After his residency at Los Angeles County Hospital, he teamed with Kerlan to specialize in the new field of sports medicine.

They supervised the medical treatment for the Dodgers and Angeles, Los Angeles Lakers, Los Angeles Rams, the Los Angeles Kings, and Anaheim Ducks, as well as other pro and amateur athletes around the country. In 1974, Dr. Jobe performed "groundbreaking" elbow surgery on John, a Dodgers pitcher who went on to successfully pitch 14 years after the operation. The surgery has since become common practice for pitchers and players at every level of baseball.

Serving the Dodgers' organization for 50 years, Dr. Jobe was also the orthopedic consultant for the PGA Tour for more than 25 years and most recently served the Dodgers as a special adviser to the chairman. Last July, the Baseball Hall of Fame honored him during its induction weekend in Cooperstown, New York, with John in attendance.
