On motion of Supervisor Ashley, seconded by Supervisor Stone, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, March 25, 2014, be adjourned in memory of Robert Bonds Jr., a 72-year-old resident of San Luis Obispo who was a member of one of Riverside's most prominent athletic families. He will always be remembered as a "tremendous person who was extremely well-mannered and respectful and could do just about anything on the athletic field."

Robert was the older brother of former Major League Baseball "standout" Bobby Bonds and 1964 Olympic hurdler Rosie Bonds-Kreidler. He was also the uncle of former Major League Baseball "great" Barry Bonds.

During high school, Robert played football, basketball, and baseball but was most accomplished in track. In 1960, he won state championships in the 120-year high hurdles and the 180-yard low hurdles. He was the first athlete in the history of the state track meet history to break 14 seconds in the high hurdles. At San Jose State, Robert was a three-year letter winner in football and led the Spartans in receiving yards, scoring, and interceptions in 1964.

As one of the first coaches hired at North High school, he coached swimming, football, and track. From 1972 until his retirement in 1991, Robert was employed at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo working in the college's learning center with disabled students. He also became a deacon and ministered to inmates at California Men's Colony.

Robert was a loving and devoted husband, father, brother, and friend whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be dearly missed.
