# BACKGROUND:

#### **Summary**

On March 12, 2013, the Board of Supervisors approved and adopted the Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP) for the Van Horn Youth Treatment and Education Center (YTEC) project. The construction documents are being prepared and the project team is making preparations for the bidding phase. This pre-qualification process for selecting a pool of qualified general contractors and security electronics subcontractors will help ensure that bids will be received from entities with a track record of experience on complex facilities such as a detention center.

The Local Agency Public Construction Act (Public Contract Code Section 20100 et seq.) and Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (Public Contract Code Section 22000 et seq.) requires officials to invite bids for construction projects and award contracts to the lowest responsible bidder. The Local Agency Public Construction Act (Public Contract Code Section 20101 et seq.) allows officials to prequalify contractors for public works projects.

It is recommended that the Board approve the Pre-Qualification Package for General Contractors and the Pre-Qualification Package for Security Electronics Subcontractors. Following a review of the General Contractor and Security Electronics Subcontractor firms' prequalifications, EDA will return to the Board for approval of a short list of firms. These firms would be invited to submit bids for the project.

#### Impact on Residents and Businesses

Approval of the pre-qualification of general contractors and security electronics subcontractors will position the county to expedite the construction of the Van Horn YTEC project. This effort will enhance public safety and provide job creation, thus providing positive impacts to area residents and businesses of Riverside.

The following General Contractor Application for Pre-Qualification (AFP) package is distributed by the County of Riverside Economic Development Agency (EDA) on behalf of the Probation Department for the County of Riverside (County) with the intent to pre-qualify General Contractors (Contractor) for construction of the public works project titled Van Horn Youth Treatment and Education Center (Project), a new secure juvenile treatment facility located at 10000 County Farm Road, Riverside, California 92503. The Project will be operated by the Riverside County Probation Department and will consist of demolition of the existing 26,000 square foot facility and construction of a new 62,000 square foot secure housing and support building including landscape, hardscape and parking.

The facility will utilize modern electronic security systems that will optimize security while ensuring a safe and secure rehabilitative environment. The facility will include various ancillary support functions including Kitchen, Medical and Administrative services. The Project is funded by the State's SB81 Local Youthful Offender Rehabilitative Facility Financing Program and the County of Riverside. Your firm is invited to review the AFP and respond to all items. Your responses will enable the County to pre-select general building contractors to bid on the Project based on experience and qualifications. Upon receipt the AFP will be opened and evaluated by the County, resulting in a list of general contractors deemed qualified to bid the Project.

AFPs are due **Friday, May 16, 2014 at 4:00 P.M.** No fax or e-mail copies will be accepted. Submittals received after the specified time and date will not be considered and will be returned unopened to the sender. THIS SUBMISSION DEADLINE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

<u>A MANDATORY Pre-Submittal Conference</u> for Contractors will take place **Tuesday, April 22, 2014 at 10:00 A.M.** at the project site located at 10000 County Farm Road in the City of Riverside, California. This meeting will include a presentation of the Project, allow for questions regarding the Project scope, and the Application for Pre-Qualification process. Contractors intending to bid this Project are required to attend this informational meeting in order to be considered for pre-qualification.

#### 1. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS AND INFORMATION

#### A. General Information

A current California type B contractor's license is required to bid the Project.

This Pre-Qualification to bid the Van Horn Youth Treatment and Education Center project (Project), located at 10000 County Farm Road, Riverside, California, is required regardless of, and in addition to, any pre-qualification for the County of Riverside (County) work which a general contractor may already have on file.

Pre-Qualification by the County, for this Project, shall remain valid until the contract for construction is awarded or until responding firms are notified in writing by the County in the unexpected event that no construction contract is awarded. It is mandatory that all General Contractors (Contractor) who intend to submit a bid fully complete the pre-qualification questionnaire, provide all materials requested, and be approved by the County to be on the final qualified Bidders list. No bid will be accepted from a Contractor that has failed to comply with these requirements. If two or more business entities submit a bid as part of a Joint Venture, or expect to submit a bid as part of a Joint Venture, each entity within the Joint Venture must be separately qualified to bid.

#### NOTES:

- 1. Each partner of joint venture proposals must individually meet the conditions of Contractor's Evaluation Form and the Contractor's License has not been suspended, put on probation or revoked at any time in the last five (5) years.
- 2. Limited Liability Corporations (LLC) will be required to comply with a Guarantee of Obligations.

Answers to questions contained in the attached questionnaire, information about current bonding capacity, notarized statement from surety, and the previous fiscal year copy of a CPA reviewed or CPA audited financial statement, with accompanying notes and supplemental information, are required. The County will use these documents as the basis of rating Contractors in respect to whether a Contractor is qualified to bid on Project. The County reserves the right to check other sources available. The County's decision will be based on objective evaluation criteria as described in the prequalification package.

The County reserves the right to adjust, increase, limit, suspend or rescind the pre-qualification rating based on subsequently learned information. Contractors whose rating changes sufficient to disqualify them will be notified, and given an opportunity for a hearing consistent with the hearing procedures described below for appealing a pre-qualification rating.

While it is the intent of the AFP and required documents to assist the County in determining bidder responsibility prior to bid and to aid the County in selecting the lowest responsible bidder, neither the fact of pre-qualification, nor any pre-qualification rating, will preclude the County from a post-bid consideration and determination of whether a bidder has the quality, fitness, capacity and experience to satisfactorily perform the proposed work, and has demonstrated the requisite trustworthiness to be awarded a contract pursuant to California Public Contract Code. This Project is being financed in part through State SB81 funding and is subject to a Labor Compliance Program per Labor Code Section 1771.3. Contractor's on the project will be required to comply with the provisions of the California Labor Code, including, without limitation, Sections 1773.1, 1774, 1775 and 1776 of the California Labor Code and including, without limitation, the obligations to pay the general prevailing rates of wages in the locality in which the Work is to be performed and comply with Section 1777.5 of the California Labor Code governing employment of apprentices.

**NOTE:** County is also conducting a prequalification for Electronic Security Subcontractors. Bidding for that portion of the Work by any General Contractor will be restricted to the prequalified Electronic Security Subcontractors. General Contractors who wish to self-perform the electronic security trade work shall be required to submit Electronic Security Subcontractors prequalification documents as specified in this prequalification package. County will furnish a list of prequalified Electronic Security Subcontractors in the bidding documents for the Project. Only prequalified Electronic Security Subcontractors will be approved by County for use in the above electronic security portion of the Work.

#### B. Data Required

All portions of AFP, Parts I through VI, should be completed with additional information attached if the space provided does not suffice. Failure to include the information called for may result in disqualification. It is essential that construction experience of the Contractor be demonstrated, as such experience is considered in establishing prequalification.

NOTE: The pre-qualification packages (questionnaire answers and financial statements) submitted by Contractors are not public records and are not open to public inspection. All information provided will be kept confidential to the extent permitted by law. However, the contents may be disclosed to third parties for purpose of verification, or investigation of substantial allegations, or in the appeal hearing. State law requires that the names of Contractors applying for pre-qualification status shall be public records subject to disclosure, and the first page of the questionnaire will be used for that purpose.

Each questionnaire must be signed under penalty of perjury in the manner designated at the end of the form, by an individual who has the legal authority to bind the Contractor on whose behalf that person is signing. If any information provided by a Contractor becomes inaccurate, the Contractor must immediately notify the County and provide updated accurate information in writing, under penalty of perjury.

The County reserves the right to waive minor irregularities and omissions in the information contained in the AFP submitted, to make all final determinations, and to determine at any time that the pre- qualification procedures will not be applied to a specific future County project.

Contractors shall submit pre-qualification packages during regular working hours on any day that the offices of the EDA are open up to the deadline of **4:00 P.M.**, **local time**, **Friday**, **May 16**, **2014**.

The County may refuse to grant pre-qualification where the requested information and materials are not provided by the submittal deadline. There is no appeal from a refusal for an incomplete or late application. The closing time for bids will not be changed in order to accommodate supplementation of incomplete submissions, or late submissions.

#### C. Current Financial Information

Contractor shall provide the previous fiscal year's copy of a CPA reviewed or CPA audited financial statement with accompanying notes and supplemental information attached. The County reserves the right to reject financial statements in which the financial condition reported is of a date 12 months or more prior to the date the AFP is due to County.

#### E. Affidavits

The appropriate affidavit must be completely executed or the application will be disqualified.

#### F. Questions

General Contractors are required to submit any questions regarding the prequalification process or the contents of the prequalification package in writing no later than 5:00 P.M., local time, **Tuesday, April 29, 2014.** Questions submitted after the deadline will not be accepted or answered. Only written inquiries will be permitted. Questions must be submitted in writing, by mail or email, to the Project Manager:

Under no circumstance are any prospective general contractors or anyone receiving the prequalification package to contact, discuss with, or inquire of any County consultant, employee, or elected official on any matter relating to this solicitation process. This requirement is to ensure that the same information is communicated to all parties and that no inconsistent, incomplete, or inaccurate information is transmitted separately. County will issue an addendum providing answers/clarifications to all written questions to all parties who have officially obtained/requested the AFP from County EDA.

#### G. Appeal Rights

Where a timely and completed application results in a rating below that necessary to pre-qualify, a Contractor may request a hearing to appeal the decision. An appeal is begun by the Contractor delivering written notice to the County of Contractor's appeal of the decision with respect to its pre-qualification rating, no later than five business days following the date of written notification from the County that the Contractor does not meet the rating established by the County. Without a timely appeal, the Contractor waives any and all rights to challenge the decision of the County, whether by administrative process, judicial process or any other legal process or proceeding. If the Contractor gives the required notice of appeal and requests a hearing, the hearing shall be conducted so that it is concluded no later than ten (10) business days after the County's receipt of the notice of appeal. The hearing shall be an informal process conducted by an Appeals Panel to which the County has delegated responsibility to hear such appeals. At or prior to the hearing, the Contractor will be advised of the basis for the County's prequalification determination. The Contractor will be given the opportunity to present information and present reasons to refute the prequalification rating and the reasons therefore. The Contractor may be represented by a person of its choosing. The hearing shall not be conducted according to technical rules relating to evidence and witnesses applicable to judicial proceedings. Any relevant evidence, including hearsay, may be received and considered if it is the sort of evidence on which reasonable persons are accustomed to rely on in the conduct of serious business affairs. The submission of documentary evidence is encouraged. The Appeals Panel shall have the power to limit oral testimony given at the hearing. Within two business days after the conclusion of the hearing, the Appeals Panel will render its decision. A copy of the written decision will be delivered to the Contractor, either personally, by registered mail, certified mail, or electronically if requested in writing by the Contractor. The determination of the Appeals Panel shall be final and not subject to further appeal. It is the intention of the County that the date for the submission and opening of bids will not be delayed or postponed to allow for completion of an appeal process.

**Note:** A contractor may be found not pre-qualified for either:

- (1) Omission of requested information or,
- (2) Falsification of information

#### 2. PROJECT OVERVIEW

#### A. Project Location and Delivery Method

The Van Horn Youth Treatment and Education Center (YTEC) is located at 10000 County Farm Road, in the City of Riverside, in Riverside County, California.

The project delivery method for Van Horn YTEC project will be through a single prime contract awarded through a Lump Sum bid package. The Project is expected to bid in Mid- 2014. The County's estimate of probable construction cost is \$26,000,000 and the anticipated construction duration is 16 months.

#### B. Project Description

The Van Horn YTEC Facility will be administered under the State of California's SB81 Program, which is authorized under the Youthful Offender Block Grant Program and provides state funded lease-revenue bond financing for construction or expansion of local youthful offender rehabilitative facilities in California.

This project will demolish an existing 26,000 square foot building and design and construct a new, approximately 62,000 square foot single story building on approximately 11 acres of a greater 50± acres of county owned land located in the city of Riverside. This facility will provide housing, program, healthcare, custody, administrative, and support services space to address the needs of approximately 106 high-risk juvenile offenders.

The housing and program space will consist of approximately 39,400 square feet and will include four 20-cell housing units, one 6-cell assessment unit, and one transitional housing unit with 9 dormitory rooms. Each living unit will include a dayroom, space for group and individual therapy, a classroom, an interview room, and all necessary appurtenances. The housing units will have access to a shared classroom and recreational space.

The facility will also include approximately 21,200 square feet for healthcare space, a central control room, kitchen and food storage areas, a laundry area, administrative space, and support services space. The support services space includes a general visitation room with two family bonding rooms, a warehouse, a maintenance shop, and staff locker rooms.

This project will include, but not be limited to, electrical; plumbing; mechanical; heating, ventilation, and air conditioning; security; and fire protection systems. The project will also include parking lots, a sally port, a central plant, a warehouse dock, emergency access roads, and all necessary appurtenances. The new facility will be constructed primarily of concrete and steel for long-term durability, and will include cost effective "green building" principles designed to achieve a LEED Silver Certification..

#### 3. EVALUATION CRITERIA

Qualifications will include:

- Evaluation and verification of General Contractor's or entity's current ability and history to secure Liability and
   Workers' Compensation insurance
- o Evidence and history of proper licensing
- o Ability to secure required bonding
- o Financial ability
- o History of litigation and claims; or other adverse actions
- o Safety record

Experience to be evaluated will include:

- o History of firm/entity
- Organization of firm/entity
- o Relevant experience of firm/entity
- Proposed management team for Project and proposed key personnel
- o Experience of proposed key personnel to be assigned to Project
- o Firm's/entity's experience in successfully completing public works projects of similar size, scope and complexity
- o Firm's/entity's experience in the utilization of Building Information Modeling (BIM)

#### **Evaluation of Comparable Project Experience**

In addition to above criteria, the Contractor shall provide information for comparable projects, as defined in this AFP.

NOTE: Scoring will be based on submitted comparable projects that meet as many of the following components as possible:

- o Relative projects within the last ten (10) years with a minimum of 40,000 gross square footage and construction costs of at least \$25,000,000.
- A minimum of 50 bed medium to high security detention facilities including medical assessment, classroom, and visitation
- Structural Concrete, including Cast in Place and Panel systems
- o Secure campus facilities
- Projects with complex interrelated building systems such as security electronics/monitoring and alarm, building and energy management, telecommunications, data distribution and other related sub-systems
- o Building Demolition, remediation and abatement

#### **Evaluation of Financial Information**

In addition to above criteria, the Contractor shall provide financial information, as defined in this AFP.

The following General Contractor Application for Pre-Qualification (AFP) package is distributed by the County of Riverside Economic Development Agency (EDA) on behalf of the Probation Department for the County of Riverside (County) with the intent to pre-qualify Electronic Security Subcontractors (Subcontractor) for the electronic security portion of the public works project titled Van Horn Youth Treatment and Education Center (Project), a new secure juvenile treatment facility located at 10000 County Farm Road, Riverside, California 92503. The Project will be operated by the Riverside County Probation Department and will consist of demolition of the existing 26,000 square foot facility and construction of a new 62,000 square foot secure housing and support building including landscape, hardscape and parking.

The facility will utilize modern electronic security systems that will optimize security while ensuring a safe and secure rehabilitative environment. The facility will include various ancillary support functions including Kitchen, Medical and Administrative services. The Project is funded by the State's SB81 Local Youthful Offender Rehabilitative Facility Financing Program and the County of Riverside. Your firm is invited to review the AFP and respond to all items. Your responses will enable the County to pre-select electronic security subcontractors to bid on the Project based on experience and qualifications. Upon receipt the AFP will be opened and evaluated by the County, resulting in a list of electronic security subcontractors deemed qualified to bid the Project.

A MANDATORY Pre-Submittal Conference for Subcontractors will take place Tuesday, April 22, 2014 at 1:00 P.M. at the project site located at 10000 County Farm Road in the City of Riverside, California. This meeting will include a presentation of the Project, allow for questions regarding the Project scope, and the Application for Pre-Qualification process. Subcontractors intending to bid this Project are required to attend this informational meeting in order to be considered for pre-qualification.

## 1. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS AND INFORMATION

## A. General Information

A current California type C7 contractor's license is required to bid the Project.

This Pre-Qualification to bid the electronic security work for the Van Horn Youth Treatment and Education Center project (Project), located at 10000 County Farm Road, Riverside, California, is required regardless of and in addition to any pre-qualification for the County of Riverside (County) work which electronic security subcontractor may already have on file.

Pre-Qualification by the County, for this Project, shall remain valid until the contract for construction is awarded or until responding firms are notified in writing by the County in the unexpected event that no construction contract is awarded. It is mandatory that all Electronic Security Subcontractors (Subcontractor) who intend to submit a bid fully complete the pre-qualification questionnaire, provide all materials requested, and be approved by the County to be on the final qualified Bidders list. It has been determined that all subcontractors who desire to submit bids on the electronic security work package for this Project must be prequalified. No bid will be accepted from a bidder that has failed to comply with these requirements. If two or more business entities submit a bid as part of a Joint Venture, or expect to submit a bid as part of a Joint Venture, each entity within the Joint Venture must be separately qualified to bid.

Answers to questions contained in the attached questionnaire, information about current bonding capacity, notarized statement from surety, and the previous fiscal year copy of a CPA reviewed or CPA audited financial statement, with accompanying notes and supplemental information, are required. The County will use these documents as the basis of rating Subcontractors that are qualified to bid. The County reserves the right to check other sources available. The County's decision will be based on objective evaluation criteria.

The County reserves the right to adjust, increase, limit, suspend or rescind the pre-qualification rating based on subsequently learned information. Subcontractors whose rating changes sufficient to disqualify them will be notified, and given an opportunity for a hearing consistent with the hearing procedures described below for appealing a pre-qualification rating.

While it is the intent of the AFP and required documents to assist the County in determining bidder responsibility prior to bid and to aid the County in selecting the lowest responsible bidder, neither the fact of pre-qualification, nor any pre-qualification rating, will preclude the County from a post-bid consideration and determination of whether a bidder has the quality, fitness, capacity and experience to satisfactorily perform the proposed work, and has demonstrated the requisite trustworthiness to be awarded a contract.

General Contractors who wish to self-perform the electronic security trade work shall be required to submit subcontractor prequalification documents as specified in this prequalification package. County will furnish a list of prequalified Electronic Security Subcontractors in the bidding documents for the Project. Only prequalified Electronic Security Subcontractors will be approved by County for use in the above electronic security portion of the Work.

This Project is being financed in part through State SB81 funding and is subject to a Labor Compliance Program per Labor Code Section 1771.3. . Contractor's on the project will be required to comply with the provisions of the California Labor Code, including, without limitation, Sections 1773.1, 1774, 1775 and 1776 of the California Labor Code and including, without limitation, the obligations to pay the general prevailing rates of wages in the locality in which the Work is to be performed and comply with Section 1777.5 of the California Labor Code governing employment of apprentices.

# B. Data Required

All portions of the AFP, Parts I through VI, should be completed with additional information attached if the space provided does not suffice. Failure to include the information called for may result in disqualification. It is essential that construction experience of the Subcontractor be demonstrated, as such experience is considered in establishing prequalification.

NOTE: The pre-qualification packages (questionnaire answers and financial statements) submitted by Subcontractors are not public records and are not open to public inspection. All information provided will be kept confidential to the extent permitted by law. However, the contents may be disclosed to third parties for purpose of verification, or investigation of substantial allegations, or in the appeal hearing. State law requires that the names of Subcontractors applying for pre-qualification status shall be public records subject to disclosure, and the first page of the questionnaire will be used for that purpose.

Each questionnaire must be signed under penalty of perjury in the manner designated at the end of the form, by an individual who has the legal authority to bind the Subcontractor on whose behalf that person is signing. If any information provided by Subcontractor becomes inaccurate, the Subcontractor must immediately notify the County and provide updated accurate information in writing, under penalty of perjury.

The County reserves the right to waive minor irregularities and omissions in the information contained in the prequalification application submitted, to make all final determinations, and to determine at any time that the prequalification procedures will not be applied to a specific future County project.

Subcontractors shall submit pre-qualification packages during regular working hours on any day that the offices of the EDA are open up to the deadline of 4:00 P.M, local time, Friday, May 16, 2014.

The County may refuse to grant pre-qualification where the requested information and materials are not provided by the submittal deadline. There is no appeal from a refusal for an incomplete or late application. The closing time for bids will not be changed in order to accommodate supplementation of incomplete submissions, or late submissions.

# C. Current Financial Information

The Subcontractor shall provide the previous fiscal year's copy of a CPA reviewed or CPA audited financial statement with accompanying notes and supplemental information attached. The County reserves the right to reject financial statements in which the financial condition reported is of a date 12 months or more prior to the date the AFP is due to County.

#### E. Affidavits

The appropriate affidavit must be completely executed or the application will be disqualified.

## F. Questions

Electronic Security Subcontractors are required to submit any questions regarding the prequalification process or the contents of the prequalification package in writing no later than 5:00 P.M, local time, Tuesday, April 29, 2014. Questions submitted after the deadline will not be accepted or answered. Only written inquiries will be permitted. Questions must be submitted in writing, by mail or email, to the Project Manager:

Under no circumstance are any prospective electronic security subcontractors or anyone receiving the prequalification package, to contact, discuss with, or inquire of any County consultant, employee, or elected official on any matter relating to this solicitation process. This requirement is to ensure that the same information is communicated to all parties and that no inconsistent, incomplete, or inaccurate information is transmitted separately. County will issue an addendum providing answers/clarifications to all written questions to all parties who have officially obtained/requested the AFP from County EDA, unless the questions pertain to a specific scope of work.

# G. Appeal Rights

Where a timely and completed application results in a rating below that necessary to pre-qualify, a Subcontractor may request a hearing to appeal the decision. An appeal is begun by the Subcontractor delivering written notice to the County of Subcontractor's appeal of the decision with respect to its pre-qualification rating, no later than five business days following the date of written notification from the County that the Subcontractor does not meet the rating established by the County. Without a timely appeal, the Subcontractor waives any and all rights to challenge the decision of the County, whether by administrative process, judicial process or any other legal process or proceeding. If the Subcontractor gives the required notice of appeal and requests a hearing, the hearing shall be conducted so that it is concluded no later than ten (10) business days after the County's receipt of the notice of appeal. The hearing shall be an informal process conducted by an Appeals Panel to which the County has delegated responsibility to hear such appeals. At or prior to the hearing, the Subcontractor will be advised of the basis for the County's pre-qualification determination. The Subcontractor will be given the opportunity to present information and present reasons to refute the prequalification rating. The Subcontractor may be represented by a person of its choosing. The hearing shall not be conducted according to the technical rules relating to evidence and witnesses applicable to judicial proceedings. Any relevant evidence, including hearsay, may be received and considered if it is the sort of evidence on which reasonable persons are accustomed to rely on in the conduct of serious business affairs. The submission of documentary evidence is encouraged.

The Appeals Panel shall have the power to limit oral testimony given at the hearing. Within two business days after the conclusion of the hearing, the Appeals Panel will render its decision. A copy of the written decision will be delivered to the Subcontractor, either personally, by registered mail, certified mail, or electronically if requested in writing by the Subcontractor. The determination of the Appeals Panel shall be final and not subject to further appeal. It is the intention of the County that the date for the submission and opening of bids will not be delayed or postponed to allow for completion of an appeal process.

**Note:** A subcontractor may be found not pre-qualified for bidding on a specific EDA contract to be let by the County, for either:

- (1)Omission of requested information or,
- (2) Falsification of information

## 2. PROJECT OVERVIEW

# A. Project Location and Delivery Method

The Van Horn Youth Treatment and Education Center (YTEC) is located at 10000 County Farm Road, in the City of Riverside, in Riverside County, California.

The project delivery method for Van Horn YTEC project will be through a single prime contract awarded through a Lump Sum bid package. The Project is expected to bid in Mid- 2014. The County's estimate of probable construction cost is \$26,000,000 and the anticipated construction duration is 16 months.

# B. Project Description

The Van Horn YTEC Facility will be administered under the State of California's SB81 Program, which is authorized under the Youthful Offender Block Grant Program and provides state funded lease-revenue bond financing for construction or expansion of local youthful offender rehabilitative facilities in California.

This project will demolish an existing 26,000 square foot building and design and construct a new, approximately 62,000 square foot single story building on approximately 11 acres of a greater 50± acres of county owned land located in the city of Riverside. This facility will provide housing, program, healthcare, custody, administrative, and support services space to address the needs of approximately 106 high-risk juvenile offenders.

The housing and program space will consist of approximately 39,400 square feet and will include four 20-cell housing units, one 6-cell assessment unit, and one transitional housing unit with 9 dormitory rooms. Each living unit will include a dayroom, space for group and individual therapy, a classroom, an interview room, and all necessary appurtenances. The housing units will have access to a shared classroom and recreational space.

The facility will also include approximately 21,200 square feet for healthcare space, a central control room, kitchen and food storage areas, a laundry area, administrative space, and support services space. The support services space includes a general visitation room with two family bonding rooms, a warehouse, a maintenance shop, and staff locker rooms.

This project will include, but not be limited to, electrical; plumbing; mechanical; heating, ventilation, and air conditioning; security; and fire protection systems. The project will also include parking lots, a sally port, a central plant, a warehouse dock, emergency access roads, and all necessary appurtenances. The new facility will be constructed primarily of concrete and steel for long-term durability, and will include cost effective "green building" principles designed to achieve a LEED Silver Certification..

## 3. EVALUATION CRITERIA

Qualifications will include:

- Evaluation and verification of Electronic Security Subcontractor's current ability and history to secure Liability and Workers' Compensation insurance
- o Firm/entity shall be a company specializing in the design, fabrication, and installation of integrated correctional or juvenile detention facility security and communications control systems for a minimum of ten (10) years
- Evidence and history of proper licensing
- o Ability to secure required bonding
- o Financial ability
- o History of litigation and claims; or other adverse actions
- Safety record

Experience to be evaluated will include:

- o History of firm/entity
- Organization of firm/entity
- o Relevant experience of firm/entity
- Proposed management team for Project and proposed key personnel
- Experience of proposed key personnel to be assigned to Project
- o Firm's/entity's experience in successfully completing public works projects of similar size, scope and complexity
- Firm's/entity's experience working with detention project general contractors and references from those contractors
- o Firm's/entity's experience in the utilization of Building Information Modeling (BIM)

#### **Evaluation of Comparable Project Experience**

In addition to above criteria, the Contractor shall provide information for comparable projects, as defined in this AFP.

# NOTE: Scoring will be based on submitted comparable projects that meet as many of the following components as possible:

- o Electronic security portion for detention facilities with:
  - A minimum of 40,000 gross square footage and construction costs of at least \$50,000,000
  - A minimum of 50 bed medium to high security detention facilities including medical assessment, classroom, and visitation
  - Secure campus facilities
  - Projects with complex interrelated building systems such as security electronics/monitoring and alarm, building and energy management, telecommunications, data distribution and other related sub-systems

#### **Evaluation of Financial Information**

In addition to above criteria, the Contractor shall provide financial information, as defined in this AFP.
