BACKGROUND:

Summary (Continued)

IV Administration Sets is expected to return annual total tubing savings of \$217,027 (savings of \$1,085,135 over 5 years). The Agreement with CareFusion requires RCRMC to commit to a Sixty (60) month obligation to purchase \$440,000 and/or 80,000 units of disposable product (Minor Kit Tray) per year from an approved Novation vendor. The attached analysis from Huron Consulting shows our expected IV Administration Sets spend of \$637,689 will easily exceed the commitment level sought

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

This product impacts patients of RCRMC many of whom reside in Riverside County.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness

RCRMC currently owns Cardinal (CareFusion compatible) IV pumps (capital purchased by the hospital) which require CareFusion disposable Dedicated IV Administration Sets. To encourage continued business with the Medical Center, CareFusion has offered improved Novation Tier pricing on future purchases for all IV tubing products (Dedicated, Non-Dedicated and tubing within IV start kits). This arrangement is advantageous to RCRMC as the Medical Center already purchases 100% of its Dedicated IV tubing from CareFusion. The approval of this multi-year agreement will allow RCRMC to save \$1,085,135 over 5 years for tubing it already exclusively purchases from CareFusion.
