In 1961, they recruited him to serve at its Cleveland headquarters in the sales promotion department where he was asked by Austin's president to assist him in transforming the company from a national to an international organization. For the next 25 years, he established operating subsidiaries and market-development offices in 20 countries, spanning Latin America, Europe, Australia, and the Far East. In that period, Austin rose to "global leadership" in its industry. He retired in 1993 as senior vice president.

In 2000, Marvin settled in Sun City Palm Desert with his wife Lois. Active in the community, he was a member of numerous professional, civic, political, and educational organizations including the Society of Professional Journalists, the Alumni Association of the University of Michigan, the World Affairs Council of the Desert, and the Democratic Party.


