On motion of Supervisor Jeffries, seconded by Supervisor Stone, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, April 29, 2014, be adjourned in memory of Eike Hohenadl, a 72-year-old prominent resident of Lake Elsinore and "leader" in the local skydiving community who died on April 25, 2014 in Arizona after his parachute malfunctioned.

As a young boy, Eike escaped from East Germany and eventually made his way to the United States. He fought in the Vietnam War, stationed aboard a 173-foot minesweeper that patrolled the Mekong Delta and the Gulf of Tonkin. After more than 30 years of service, he retired from the U.S. Navy with the rank of captain. In the 1990's, he served as manager of a major disposal project at the Fallbrook Naval Weapons Facility involving Vietnam-era napalm.

Eike was a very experienced and admired skydiver and wingsuit instructor who enjoyed doing skydiving demonstrations at public events. He had thousands of jumps under his belt and held numerous U.S. Parachute Association licenses and ratings, including safety and training adviser.

Eike's memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed.
