He went on to record 50 albums and had hits into the mid-1960s with his signature "Al Di La," "Have You Looked Into Your heart," "Two Purple Shadows," "I Live Each Day," "Innamorata," and "You Don't Know Me." His recording of "The Star-Spangled Banner" in the 1960s was played at sporting events for years.

Jerry made appearances on "The Ed Sullivan Show," "The Tonight Show with Johnny Carson," and "The Mike Douglas Show" and appeared as himself in the movies "Goodfellas," "Casino," and the TV series "The Sopranos." He also performed in Las Vegas casinos and on the nightclub circuit.


