

BACKGROUND: The U.S. Congress has announced bipartisan, bicameral legislation to reform and strengthen the workforce investment system of the nation to put Americans back to work and make the United States more competitive in 21st Century. The National Association of Workforce Boards including the Riverside County Workforce Investment Board worked with Congress to craft this legislation. The legislation strengthens the alignment between local and workforce areas and labor market and economic development regions.



5 SUPPORT OF THE FEDERAL WORKFORCE INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT

7 **WHEREAS**, the U.S. Congress has announced bipartisan, bicameral legislation to reform and
8 strengthen the workforce investment system of the Nation to put Americans back to work and make the
9 United States more competitive in the 21st Century; and

10 **WHEREAS**, the National Association of Workforce Boards, the voice for all 550 Workforce
11 Investment Boards across the country, including the Riverside County Workforce Investment Board,
12 worked with Congress to craft this legislation, has offered its full endorsement; and

13 **WHEREAS**, the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act will modernize and improve existing
14 federal workforce development programs; and

15 **WHEREAS**, the legislation strengthens the alignment between local workforce areas and labor
16 markets and economic development regions; and

17 **WHEREAS**, the legislation strengthens the connection between adult education, postsecondary
18 education, and the workforce; and

19 **WHEREAS**, the legislation ensures that individuals with disabilities have the skills necessary to
20 be successful in competitive, integrated employment; and

21 **WHEREAS**, the legislation focuses youth services on out-of-school youth, high school dropout
22 recovery efforts, and attainment of recognized postsecondary credentials that will result in a more
23 productive future workforce for the county; and

24 **WHEREAS**, the legislation is consistent with the county's economic and workforce development
25 strategy to enhance the economic position of the county by preparing and educating a highly skilled
26 workforce to meet the needs of the regional economy; and

27 **WHEREAS**, the county is committed to creating a workforce system focused on innovation and
28 skills development; and

1 **WHEREAS**, the county is responsive to the economic imperatives of our industry partners by
2 helping them find the skilled employees they need to compete and create jobs in America; and

3 **BE IT RESOLVED, FOUND, DETERMINED AND ORDERED** by the Board of Supervisors
4 of the County of Riverside, California, in regular session assembled on June 3, 2014, at 9:00 a.m., in the
5 meeting room of the Board of Supervisors located on the 1st floor of the County Administrative Center,
6 4080 Lemon Street, Riverside, California, that the County of Riverside supports the passage of the federal
7 Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act; and

8 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Board of Supervisors that the County of Riverside
9 supports an overall investment in workforce development that will develop dynamic and well-supported
10 workforce investment programs in order for the county and the Nation to compete globally and
11 sustainably.
