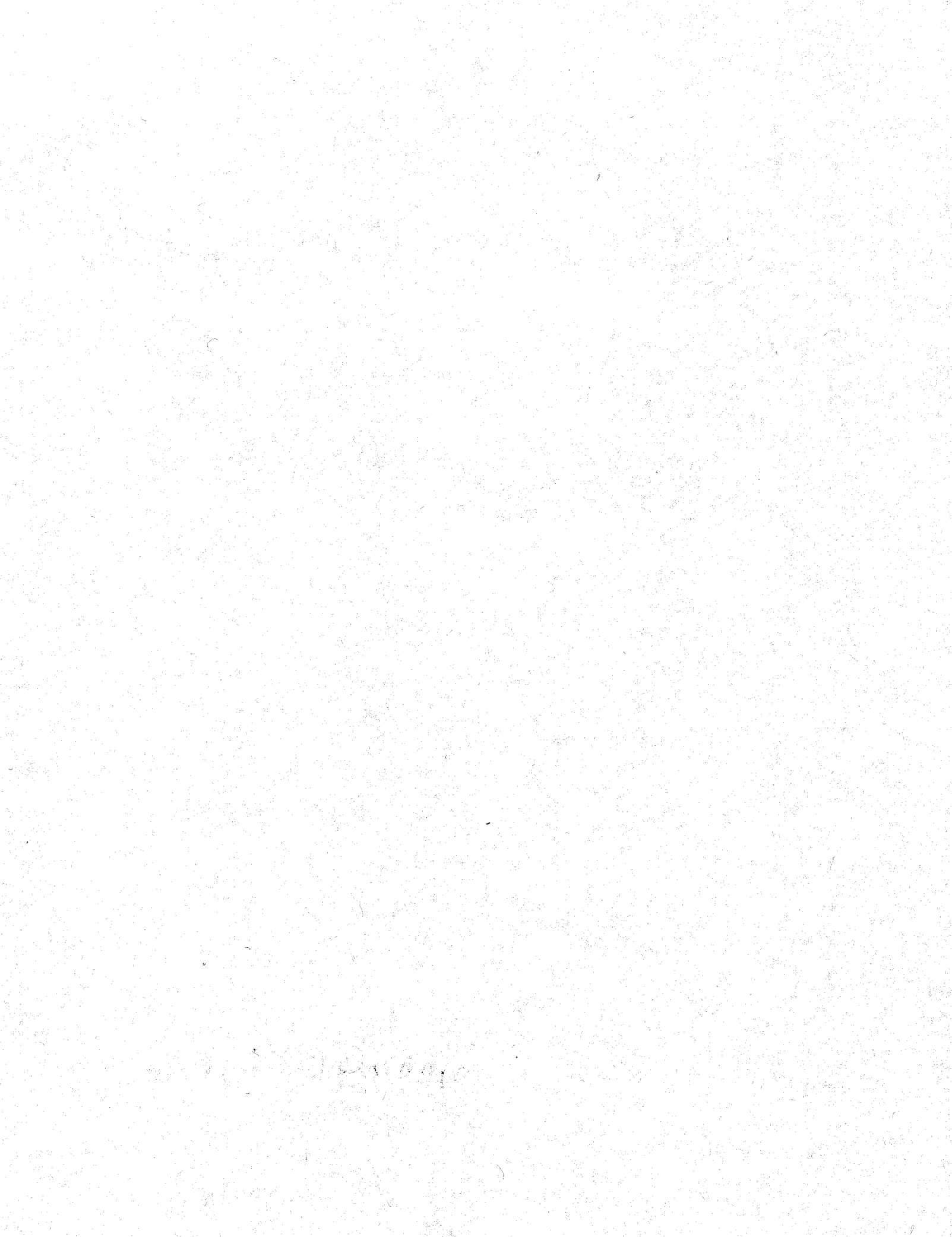

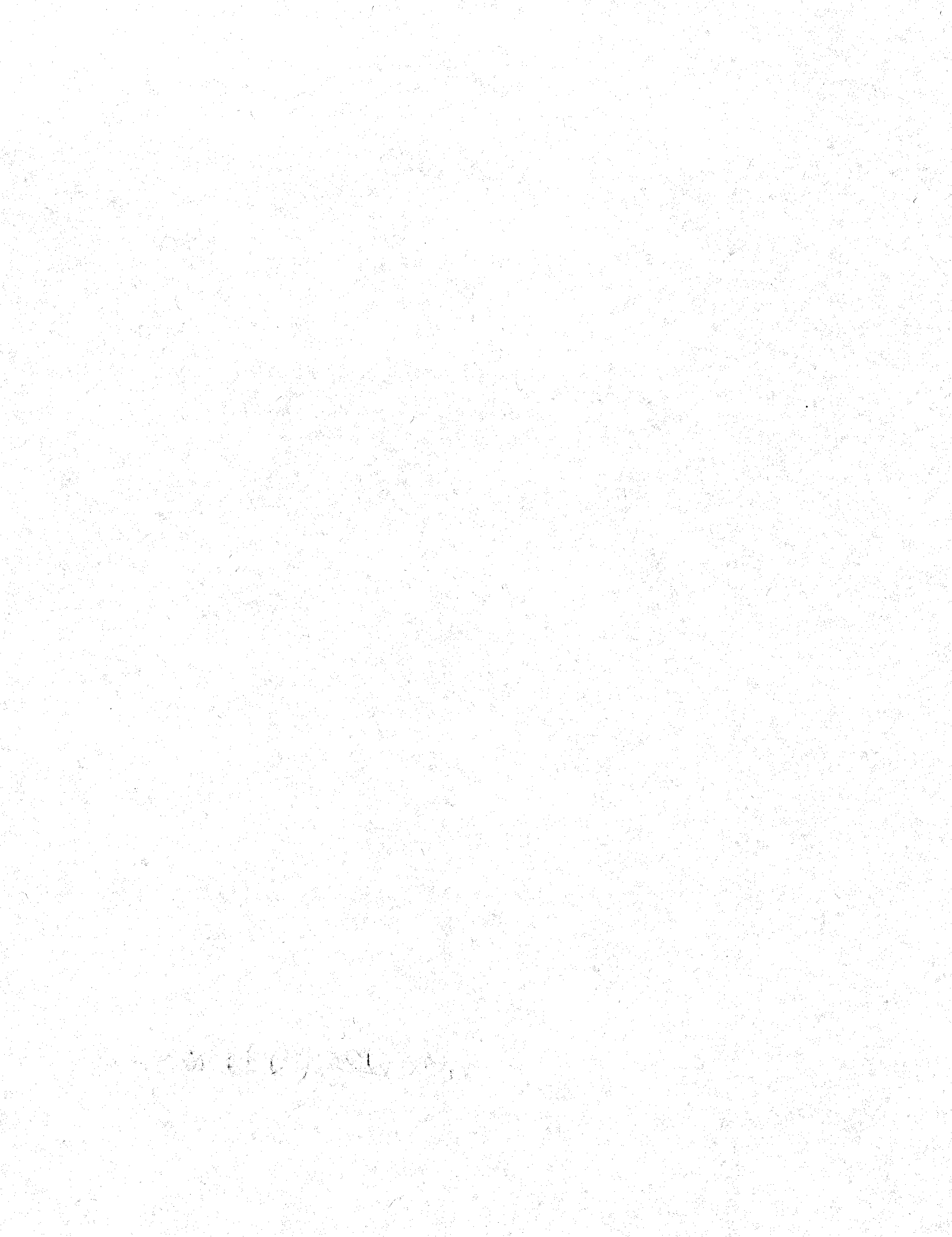

The author of 18 books, Jim received a Gold Medallion Award for his book "Growing Through Divorce" which was released in 1976. He presented more than 700 workshops dealing with the scars of divorce across the United States and Canada. His book has sold almost 700,000 copies and is still used as a primary resource at divorce recovery seminars and in counseling centers and churches around the world.

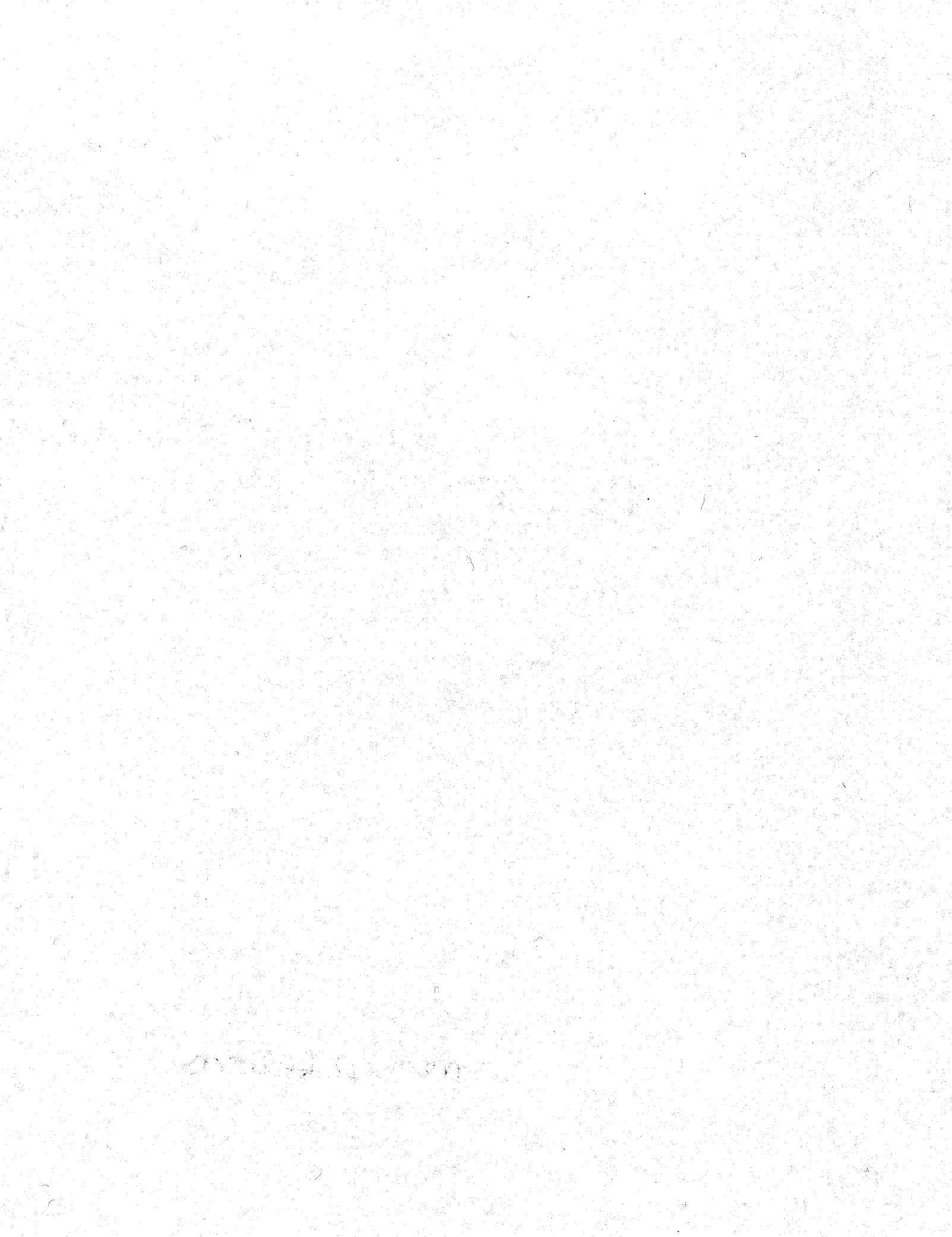

Born on September 16, 1934, in Ketchikan, Alaska, DD graduated from Ketchikan High School in 1952 and San Jose State University in 1956. She joined the U.S. Navy and served in Key West, Florida; Newport, Rhode Island; and Washington, D.C. In 1959, she retired from active duty as a lieutenant junior grade and transferred to the U.S. Navy Reserve. She became one of the earliest women to reach to reach the upper ranks; and in 1981, she was the only woman in the U.S. to reach the rank of Navy Reserve Captain.

DD then joined the Civil Service working for the U.S. Army where she spent many years providing services to military youth and dependents. She was one of only two recreation specialists Army-wide in the advanced grade of GS-12 managing the youth activities programs in the U.S. and Europe. In the late 1990's, she retired to Palm Desert.



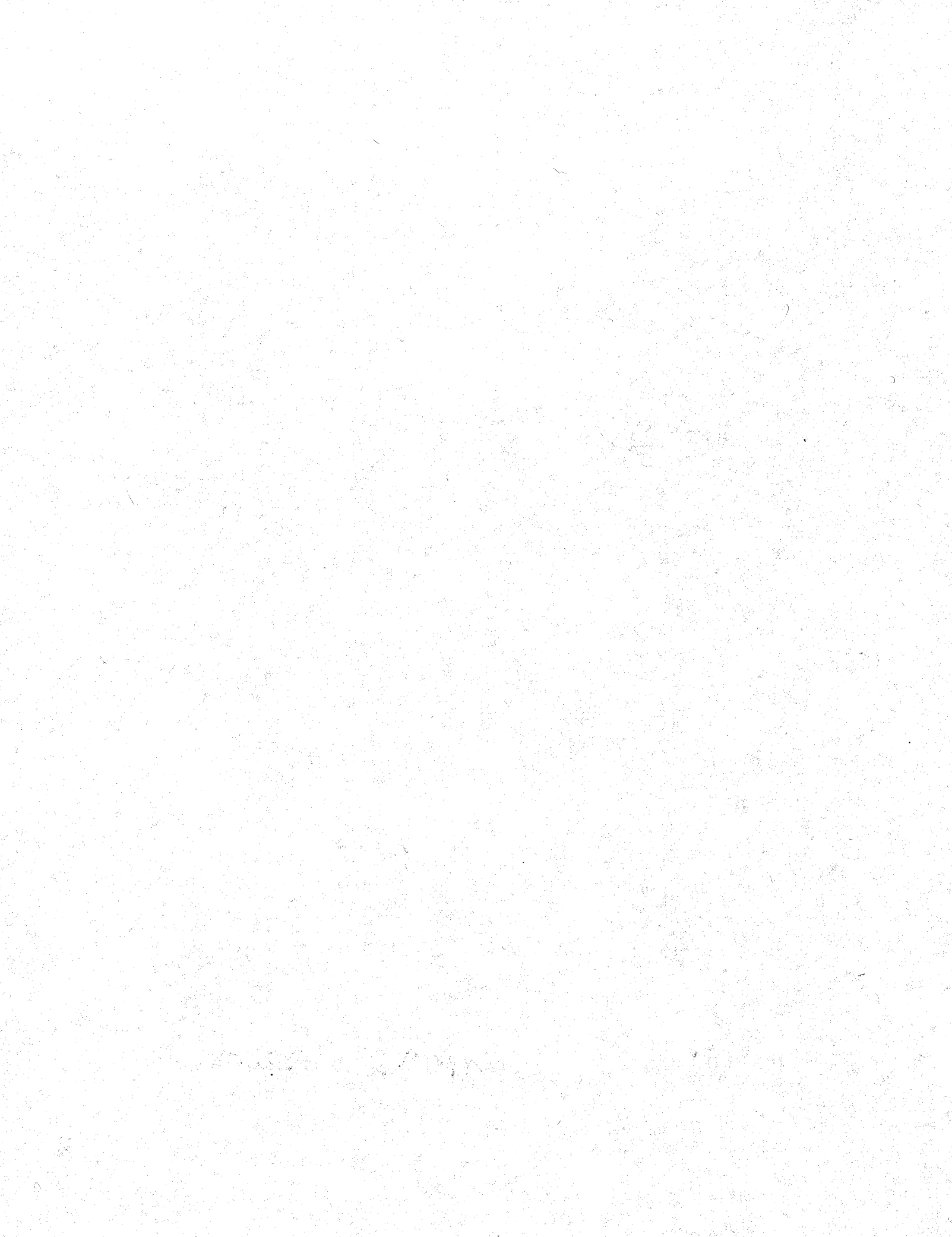
