He served on the Board of the Jurupa Area Recreation and Park District from 1984 to 1990 and then again from 1999 to December 2012 when he left to take a seat on the Board of Education. He also served as co-chairman of the Children's Christmas Party and was a member of the Boards of Directors of the Jurupa Valley Community foundation and of the Jurupa Mountains Discovery Center.

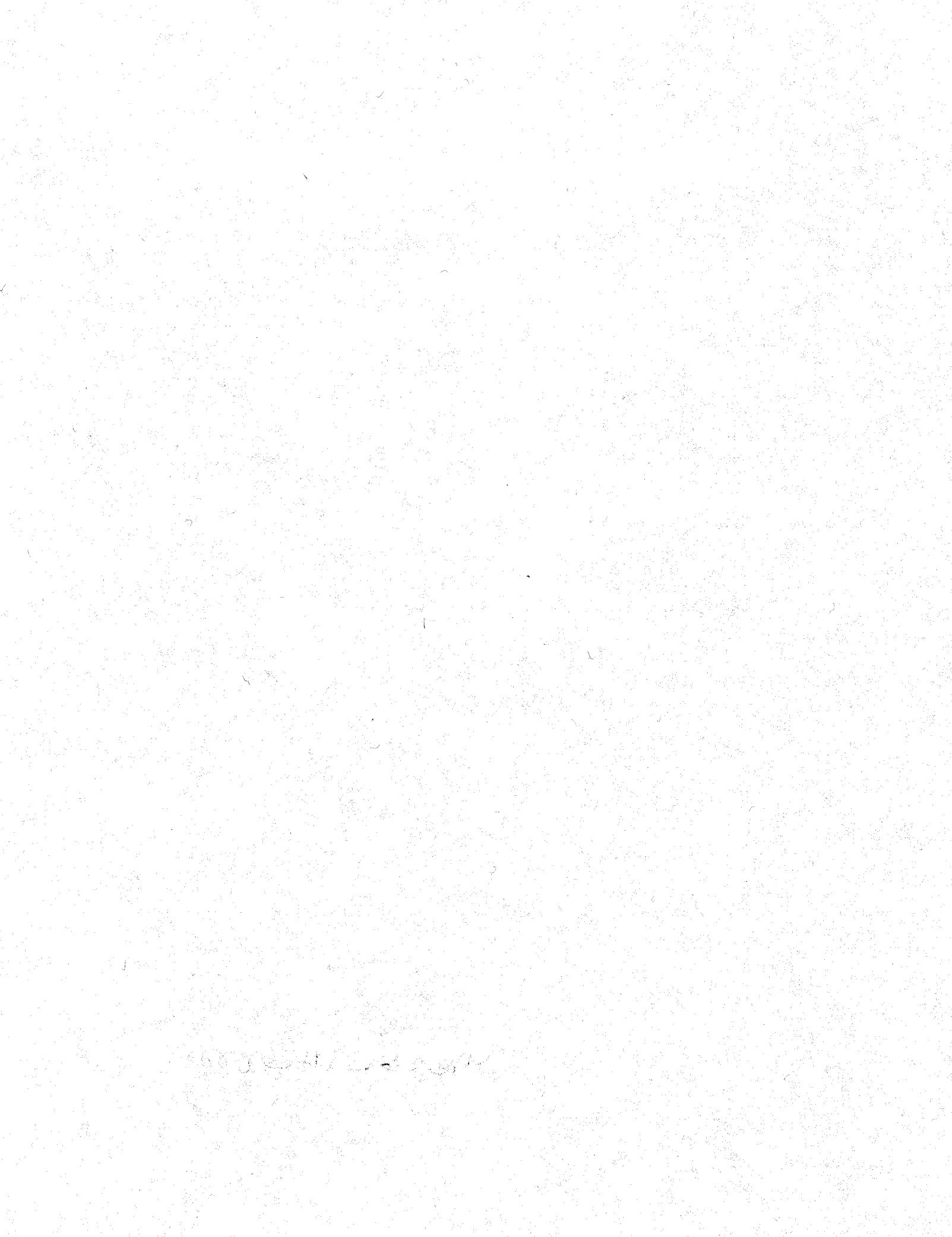
