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BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. **Community Connect - \$500** funding will be used to support the education and training of non-profits in Riverside County. Training will consist of leadership and professional development skills, grant writing, marketing, and workplace wellness.
2. **Fire & Burn Foundation - \$1,000** funding will be used to support the Emergency Needs Program which alleviates the immediate financial burden resulting from a burn injury.
3. **Assistance League of Temecula Valley - \$2,500** funding will be used to support the Operation School Bell program. The program plans on clothing at least 545 disadvantaged schoolchildren in the First District.
