BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

- 1. Community Connect \$500 funding will be used to support the education and training of non-profits in Riverside County. Training will consist of leadership and professional development skills, grant writing, marketing, and workplace wellness.
- 2. Fire & Burn Foundation \$1,000 funding will be used to support the Emergency Needs Program which alleviates the immediate financial burden resulting from a burn injury.
- 3. Assistance League of Temecula Valley \$2,500 funding will be used to support the Operation School Bell program. The program plans on clothing at least 545 disadvantaged schoolchildren in the First District.
