BACKGROUND:

Summary

Impact of fuels-under-the-cap regulation will have an increased price of fuel for consumers. This increase will cause the most harm to drivers who commute for work or drive to larger communities for services such as healthcare, or to obtain household necessities. Unemployment rates are in double digits which places our citizens at a disadvantage when it comes to paying for basic necessities like fuel. The estimates put this increase in the price of gas between .16 and .76 cents per gallon. Many citizens in Riverside County are unaware that this price increase is pending. Greenhouse gas reduction goals are already on track and will not be helped by this massive price increase.

SUPPORT DELAYING THE IMPLEMENTATION

OF FUELS UNDER CAP AND TRADE

WHEREAS, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors is deeply concerned about the impact of the fuels-under-the-cap regulation on Riverside County, and the increased price of fuel for consumers; and

WHEREAS, any increase in the price of fuel will harm the most vulnerable members of our communities, particularly those who must continue to commute to work or drive to larger communities for services such as healthcare or to obtain household necessities, and who are least able to diversify their transportation options; and

WHEREAS, Riverside County's economy is still fragile and is already facing potential negative impacts from a sustained drought; and

WHEREAS, many Californians are still unemployed and unemployment rates in Riverside County remain in double digits which places our citizens at a disadvantage when it comes to paying for basic necessities like fuel; and

WHEREAS, estimates put the probable increase in the price of gas between 16 and .76 cents per gallon, adding up to \$7 to the price of a tank of gas; and

WHEREAS, the majority of Riverside County residents are unaware that this price increase is pending; and
