He achieved the rank of SMSGT and was given a total of three Oak Leaf Clusters. He was also recognized with personal letters from three different Generals praising his innovative and efficient work.

When he retired from the USAF, Eugene spent 16 years with the Riverside County Data Processing Department and was put in charge of building the network for computer services to every County office. After retiring from the County in 1984, he volunteered for 12 years at the March Air Field Museum and the Jurupa Cultural Center where he built many of the displays.

Eugene was a loving and devoted husband, father, and friend whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed.
