While at Southwest Juvenile Hall, he helped to develop the Canine Support Program and was a moving force for the continued success of the program. Dale had such a passion for the canine program that he even adopted one of the dogs.

In June of 2013, Dale was chosen to help join the Youthful Offender Program, a treatment oriented program at Riverside Juvenile Hall. He was very excited to start a new work assignment and sincerely believed in making positive changes in the lives of youth.

Dale was a loving and devoted husband, father, son, brother, and friend whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed and his commitment to changing lives and making a difference will leave a lasting legacy.

On motion of Supervisor Tavaglione, seconded by Supervisor Stone, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, October 7, 2014, be adjourned in memory of Richard "Dick" Dickerson, a 77-year-old resident and former Mayor of Redding who passed away on September 29, 2014.

A native of Colorado, Dick moved to Southern California following his discharge from the United States Army. His successful thirty-year career in law enforcement began with the Riverside Police Department where he became an outstanding law enforcement officer, investigator, and leader. He was also the first elected FOP President of Lodge 8 in Riverside and was the primary reason Lodge 8 got started and prospered during their formative years in 1973 and 1974.

In 1986, Dick relocated to Redding to start the Shasta Interagency Narcotics Task Force for the California Department of Justice. After his retirement in 1993, he was appointed by Governor Pete Wilson to a vacancy on the Shasta County Board of Supervisors and was later elected to serve a four-year term. He served as a member of the California State Assembly from 1998 to 2002 and ran in the Republican primary for State Senate in 2002 but was defeated. He also served on the Redding City Council from 2004 to 2012. As a councilmember, he rotated with the other members in the position of Mayor of Redding.

An instrumental force in the community, Dick served on the Board of Directors of the Shasta County Youth Violence Prevention Council and twice served as Chair of the United Way Campaign. He was past president of the Shasta County Peace Officers Association, Redding Rodeo Association Board of Directors, and the Emergency Services Foundation. He was also a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the American Legion.

Dick was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather, and friend whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will always be remembered as "one of the good guys who had a big heart and looked out for public safety and youth prevention." He will be greatly missed.

The Board of Supervisors commemorates his service to the County of Riverside.
