BACKGROUND:

Summary (continued)

On April 20, 2004 (Item No. 11.2), the Board of Supervisors approved the Contract Agreement for Support for Regional NPDES Program Activities (Agreement) between the District and the Community Health Agency, Department of Environmental Health to provide funding in support of its Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)/Anti-Freeze, Batteries, Oil and Latex Paint (ABOP) collection programs and the commercial/industrial business Compliance Assistance Program (CAP).

On June 30, 2009 (Item No. 3.17), the Board of Supervisors approved Amendment No. 1 to the Agreement to (i) amend the scope of services; (ii) extend the term of the Agreement for another five (5) years; and continue funding to the County in support of its commercial/industrial business Compliance Assistance Program (CAP).

County, through its commercial/industrial business Compliance Assistance Program (CAP) program, assisted the District with NPDES MS4's permits compliance during Fiscal Year 2013-14 as required by the Regional Water Quality Control Boards, County of Riverside, Coachella Valley Water District (CVWD), and the following Cities: Banning, Cathedral City, Coachella, Desert Hot Springs, Indian Wells, Indio, La Quinta, Palm Desert, Palm Springs, Rancho Mirage, Beaumont, Calimesa, Canyon Lake, Corona, Eastvale, Hemet, Jurupa Valley, Lake Elsinore, Menifee, Moreno Valley, Norco, Perris, Riverside and San Jacinto (Cities). The regulatory requirements imposed on businesses and local government by the United States Environmental Protection Agency and State of California through the NPDES stormwater program continues to escalate. Therefore, the above program resulted in additional tasks and associated compensation that exceeded the contract limit set for Fiscal Year 2013-2014 by \$35,000. District staff is recommending that the Board approve the \$35,000 to pay for inspection services conducted in Fiscal Year 2013-2014.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

This Agreement allows the District to implement stormwater quality inspections for businesses in a cost effective manner. Costs incurred under this amendment will be funded by i) the existing Benefit Assessments for the Santa Ana, Santa Margarita, and Whitewater Watersheds, as appropriate, and ii) contributions from CVWD, the County of Riverside and any Cities, as appropriate.

AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO CONTRACT AGREEMENT - SUPPORT FOR REGIONAL NPDES PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

The Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, hereinafter called "DISTRICT", and the County of Riverside, hereinafter called "COUNTY" on behalf of its Department of Environmental Health, previously entered into that certain Agreement dated April 20, 2004, hereinafter referred to as "AGREEMENT", that provided for COUNTY to perform certain National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Program Activities for DISTRICT in support of DISTRICT'S Commercial/Industrial Compliance Assistance Program; and

On June 30, 2009, DISTRICT and COUNTY entered into Amendment No. 1 to extend the term of AGREEMENT and to reduce the scope of services to be provided by COUNTY; and

DISTRICT desires COUNTY to provide additional inspection services above the level specified in AGREEMENT in support of NPDES program and COUNTY is willing to perform such work as requested by DISTRICT; and

DISTRICT and COUNTY desire to acknowledge and affirm that COUNTY has continued to provide additional inspection services for DISTRICT beyond the term of Amendment No. 1 in anticipation of the approval and execution of this Amendment No. 2 by DISTRICT and COUNTY; and

DISTRICT and COUNTY mutually agreed that the amount of compensation to be paid for said additional inspection services shall not exceed thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000). Furthermore, DISTRICT and COUNTY mutually agreed that, upon approval of this Amendment No. 2 by DISTRICT'S Board of Supervisors, the total amount of compensation for FIELD SERVICES under said AGREEMENT shall be increased from two hundred seventy-

five thousand dollars (\$275,000) to three hundred ten thousand dollars (\$310,000) for Fiscal Year 2013-2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, DISTRICT and COUNTY mutually agree to amend the AGREEMENT as follows:

- Subsection 2.(d) is changed to read:
 DISTRICT shall contribute a sum not to exceed three hundred ten thousand dollars (\$310,000) (REIMBURSEMENT) for Fiscal Year 2013-2014 to support FIELD SERVICES and ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS/LITIGATION SUPPORT.
- Except to the extent specifically added to, modified or amended herein, all of
 the terms, covenants and conditions of said AGREEMENT dated April 20,
 2004, and Amendment No. 1 dated June 30, 2009 shall remain in full force
 and effect between the parties hereto.
