BACKGROUND:

<u>Summary</u>

The California Emergency Management Agency ("Cal OES") has awarded the Riverside County District Attorney's Office the Victim Witness Assistance Program ("VW") grant for FY14-15.

The VW program is designed to provide comprehensive services to assist victims/witnesses of all types of violent crime. The services include crisis intervention, emergency assistance, resource and referral assistance, direct counseling, victim of crime claims, property return, orientation to the criminal justice system, court escort, training for criminal justice agencies, public presentations, case status/disposition, notification of family, friends, and employees, and restitution.

In addition to the services listed above, Advocates assigned to the grant will conduct field visits when necessary; educate, recruit and use volunteers; assess the needs of disabled and home bound victims in order to provide services; provide translation and interpreter services; encourage referrals from law enforcement and community-based organizations; and maintain a formal system of networking and coordination with other agencies.

Funds awarded will be used directly on the salaries, benefits, and direct operating expenses for Victim Services Advocate positions and a Victim Services Supervisor.

Based on an estimated award, the DA's Office budgeted \$932,432 for FY14/15 in this revenue category. A budget adjustment of \$111,157 is necessary to increase revenues to match the award amount of \$1,043,589 (see attached Schedule A).

The grant award and resolution have been reviewed and approved as to form by County Counsel.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

All costs under this program will be recovered through grant funding.

III. Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 – (Subrecipient Handbook, Section 2152)

VIII. Civil Rights Compliance
