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BACKGROUND:

Summary

The California Emergency Management Agency ("CalOES") has awarded the Riverside County District Attorney's Office the Underserved Victim Advocacy and Outreach Program ("UV") Sub grant award.

The UV program is designed to provide support for communities to improve their ability to identify the needs of unserved/underserved crime victims in California. The intent of the UV program is to focus on service delivery to victims of violent crime within unserved/underserved and socially isolated populations including, but not limited to, those historically underserved due to race, socio-economic status, disability, or sexual orientation.

For more than 13 years, the District Attorney's Division of Victim Services ("DVS") has provided bilingual and culturally sensitive services to victims/survivors of crime through funding from the CalOES Special Emphasis Program, which ended September 30, 2010. Funding from the UV program allows DVS to continue to provide culturally sensitive services to victims/survivors and narrow the scope of services to the most violent and serious crimes prosecuted by the District Attorney's Office.

Funds awarded will be used directly on the salaries, benefits and direct operating expenses for bilingual Victim Services Advocate positions. Advocates assigned to the UV Program will provide bilingual, culturally sensitive services to victims and witnesses of homicide, gang-related, assault, drunk driving and other felonies.

The total grant award of \$156,250 is for funding period October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2015. The District Attorney has budgeted \$125,000 in the department's current fiscal year budget, as well as the required 20% County match of \$25,000. The remaining balance will be budgeted in FY 2015-2016. This funding source for such a critical program provides a 400 percent return on the County's matching funds.

The grant award and resolution have been reviewed and approved as to form by County Counsel.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

All costs under this program will be recovered through grant funding.

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the resolution shall be in effect for a three-year period
20 beginning October 1, 2014 and ending September 30, 2017.
