On motion of Supervisor Benoit, seconded by Supervisor Stone, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, November 24, 2014, be adjourned in memory of Edward "Ed" Elder, a 94-year-old resident of Desert Hot Springs who was born on March 18, 1920 in Ronan, Montana.

A United States Army Veteran, Ed proudly served his Country as an MP, Lieutenant, and Tank Commander in Patton's Fourth Armored Division fighting across France and was part of the rescue of Bastogne in the Battle of the Bulge. In 1950, he was called back into the Army for the Korean War and trained at Fort Hood and Fort Ord in Texas and California but was never sent to Korea.

When he returned to civilian life in 1952, Ed used his MP experience to run for Sheriff of Lane County and won. During his time in office, he was responsible for jail improvements and law enforcement improvements. He also completed a 12-week course at the FBI Academy in Washington, D.C. in 1956.

After leaving the Sheriff's Office in 1961, Ed ran for State Legislature in Oregon on the Republican ticket and was elected in a predominantly Democratic District. He served in the State House of Representatives until 1967 and was considered a very effective legislator. By his last term he became Chairman of the Fish and Game Committee.

From 1961 through his retirement in 1990, Ed worked as a successful insurance adjuster for various insurance companies. After living in Oregon most of his life, he migrated to Desert Hot Springs to retire and enjoy the warm climate. He occasionally worked on ballot measure campaigns in California during retirement.

Ed was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and friend whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be dearly missed.

An instrumental force in the community, Jerry served on the Board of Directors of the Chamber of Commerce, the United Fund, the Palm Springs Youth Center, and the local chapter of the American Red Cross. He was also involved with the Palm Springs Chapter of the Junior Chamber of Commerce and served as president of the Rotary Club, the Palm Springs Club, and the Desert Press Club. For his dedicated service, he was awarded the Jaycees Citizen of the Year in 1964.

From 1967 to 1973, Jerry served as the general manager of the Palm Springs Chamber of Commerce. He later served as manager of the Chambers of Commerce in the cities of Claremont, California; Santa Cruz, California; and Lake Havasu City, Arizona. He ultimately returned to the Palm Springs area where he had a successful career as a real estate agent and eventually retired to Sun City Palm Desert where he was active in the Solos Club.
