2. Authorize the Chairman to sign the First Amendment for state legislative services with Michael Y. Corbett.

BACKGROUND:

Summary

On March 24, 2015, the Board authorized a continuation of services in Sacramento and Washington DC, but modified staff's recommendation, by authorizing the continued use of Michael Y. Corbett from January through October 31, 2015. The contract for Mr. Corbett for the first ten months of the year will follow the entire state legislative session, allowing the county to maintain service levels in criminal justice analysis and allow for a transition for those services to be taken over by Nielsen-Merksamer in 2016. The Board authorized ten months for a total contract of \$30,000 for the calendar-year.

BACKGROUND:

Summary (continued)

The advocacy efforts this past year were quite diverse covering issues related to SB 90 Mandate Reimbursements, AB 109 public safety realignment, Health Care/ACA implementation, CEQA reform, restoring lost funding to the County's four newest cities, and Salton Sea Restoration just to name a few.

Some examples include the modifications to the hospital formula negotiated with CSAC and other stakeholder groups; the AB 109 Growth Formula allocation that resulted in more funds to Riverside County than previously proposed. Mr. Corbett's vast experience and high profile contacts within the administration, Department of Finance, and criminal justice community have given our county direct access to numerous policy and decision-makers in Sacramento.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

There is no impact on residents and businesses. Advocacy by the county has the potential to reduce duplicative regulations, improve the regions standing for state mandates, seek quality of life improvements, promote our region at the state level, and reduce the state's dependence on solving their budget problems on the backs of local government.

Contract History and Price Reasonableness

The Purchasing Department solicited bids two years ago and the firms of Nielsen-Merksamer, Cline-Duplissea, and Michael Y. Corbett were the only responsive bidders. The three firms have provided service to the County for the past decade. Under the prior agreement, the county paid \$395,000 annually for state lobbying services. Through the RFP negotiation, the contracts were reduced by 43%, down to \$224,000 (savings of \$171,000). Michael Y. Corbett received a one-year contract to focus on specific and focused analysis, while Nielsen-Merksamer received a three-year agreement (as they were selected as the county's lead lobbyist). The annual contracts for state advocacy for 2015 total \$174,000, and include Nielsen-Merksamer (\$144,000), Michael Y. Corbett (\$30,000).
