

CVEP Pathways to Success and partners will award scholarships to more than 315 Coachella Valley high school seniors and current college students who are pursuing their bachelor degree and who demonstrate financial need.
 4. The Health Assessment Resource Center's (HARC) mission is to provide objective reliable research, analysis and technical service of health needs to the Coachella Valley. HARC provides communities with valuable data to improve the lives of the residents.
 5. The Law Enforcement Appreciation Committee (LEAC) will host the 37th Annual Law Enforcement Appreciation Ceremony and Fundraiser on April 30, 2015. Law enforcement officers will be honored for their exemplary service to their communities. LEAC is comprised of business people, community representatives, officers and public officials from agencies throughout the County who volunteer their time to host this annual event.

6. Membership in the Palm Springs Hospitality Association allows the Fourth District to continue working closely with local businesses to continue to develop the tourism industry in the desert. Tourism is a major driver of the Coachella Valley economy and hoteliers are reporting record business and increasing room rates. Close coordination between tourism businesses and local government officials have developed an atmosphere for attracting visitors.
7. The Palm Springs Chamber of Commerce will host the 5th Annual Police and Fire Appreciation Luncheon on May 7, 2015. This luncheon is designed to recognize the men and women who serve and protect the City of Palm Springs with courage and dedication.
8. The RCRMC Foundation's Spring Garden Tour is a fundraising event that is dedicated to the RCCAT/CAN Unit. In addition, this fundraiser helps support the annual parenting conference which serves as a venue to educate young parents and caregivers.
9. The Indio Rotary Math Field Day will be held on May 2, 2015 at John Glenn Middle School in Indio. Three school districts in the Coachella Valley, and private schools, participate with more than 350 students competing for recognition for themselves and their schools. This event encourages students to study and enjoy math while motivating them to develop and apply their math skills.
