



Term of Appointment: Public Resources Code 9305 specifies that director terms shall be staggered. There are five directors on the PVRCD board. Four directors have applied for reappointment. To comply with state laws, the terms will be staggered accordingly:

Jack Seiler and Joseph DeConinck will serve full terms expiring November 30, 2018.

Robert Hull and Daniel Robinson will serve partial terms expiring November 30, 2016

BACKGROUND/APPOINTEE INFORMATION:

The Palo Verde Resource Conservation District (PVRCD) promotes the conservation and wise use of natural resources in the Palo Verde Valley. The PVRCD is an independent state special district that works through public and private partnerships to assist farmers, homeowners, municipalities, golf course superintendents and other land users conserve soil, water, air, plant and animal resources.

California resource conservation districts (RCDs) are established, governed and authorized under Division 9 of the Public Resources Code. RCDs work to conduct:

- Watershed planning and management
- Water conservation, quality protection and enhancement
- Agricultural land conservation
- Wetland and wildlife conservation and habitat enhancement
- Recreational land restoration
- Conservation education

Four qualified candidates have applied to be reappointed, Joseph De Coninck, Daniel E. Robinson, Jack Seiler and Robert Hull.

Each applicant is an active farmer and has served on the RCD as a director for many years.
