BACKGROUND:

Summary (Continued)

Services Division (ASD) and In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) Public Authority (PA) staff on the special needs of IHSS recipients who are seniors, or individuals with a disability or debilitating medical condition. Part of the IHSS Advisory Committee (AC) training plan is a panel presentation composed of three (3) or four (4) IHSS recipients and three (3) or four (4) IHSS providers. The panel approach allows ASD and PA staff to participate in a guided discussion with IHSS recipients and home care providers on varying viewpoints, and educate them on the sensitivity of the needs of IHSS recipients who have a disability. The goals of the panel are:

- To offer insight on the very complex issues involving the care of people who are aging or have disabilities;
- · To provide perspective on the benefits and limitations afforded by the IHSS entitlement program; and
- To gain an understanding of the very special roles that the Department of Public Social Services (DPSS)
 and PA staff play in helping facilitate a better quality of life for DPSS customers.

The flat-rate stipend of \$50 per person/per event would cover up to four (4) hours of activities directly related to the training endeavor, including: training preparatory time, travel, and actual time spent in the panel or training event. In the current fiscal year, the stipend would be applied to staff education sessions scheduled between December 1, 2014 and June 30, 2015. This IHSS Advisory Committee training stipend will also support customer service and sensitivity courses planned for future fiscal years, with a total training stipend amount not to exceed \$2,000 each fiscal year.

On December 4, 2014, the IHSS Advisory Committee voted unanimously to support cost of the training stipends out of the Advisory Committee budget.

Impact on Residents and Businesses

These training sessions will provide an increased sensitivity to working with Riverside County individuals who have a disability.
