**BACKGROUND:**

**Summary (continued)**

The LISTOS program was developed to fill a void in the area of Spanish-language disaster preparedness education, both locally and nationally. The mission of LISTOS is to provide Spanish-speaking populations with information about the importance of disaster readiness, including the sharing of preparedness skills and information with family and friends. The LISTOS curriculum emphasizes targeted recruitment and Spanish-language presentations tailored to the specific cultural and linguistic needs of the Latino communities.

The core of the LISTOS design is based on building sustainable relationships and partnerships with local businesses, community leaders, and non-profit organizations. In doing so, LISTOS is able to provide valuable disaster awareness information to vulnerable populations, while simultaneously helping those same populations to become familiar with public services available to them. The LISTOS methodology draws from lessons learned through a variety of widely-distributed disaster preparedness education tools as well as the best practices of other non-English speaking public education initiatives.

LISTOS curriculum is taken from the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) curriculum and is intended to be a stepping-stone to CERT. LISTOS prepares participants not only for disasters, but also encourages them to seek additional disaster readiness training, including CERT.

The LISTOS program was piloted and developed in a public/private partnership in the County of Santa Barbara. The LISTOS program has been very successful in the County of Santa Barbara, and the implementation of LISTOS is being encouraged statewide. The County of Riverside will be one of the first counties to formally adopt and support the LISTOS program following Santa Barbara County.

Although the County of Riverside has incorporated outreach and training to the Spanish speaking community, the adoption of the LISTOS program will formalize and enhance the current efforts being made by the department. The methodology of the LISTOS program is to partner County staff and volunteer community leaders. Through this partnership, the county will be able to train and utilize these volunteer leaders to further disseminate the LISTOS program throughout their communities.

**Impact on Citizens and Businesses**

LISTOS is intended to enhance outreach efforts in Riverside County through emergency preparedness education to Latino populations while also supporting organizational readiness and strengthening community resiliency.
