While living in an orphanage with his family in Banning in the 1930's, Tony learned early lessons in work ethics which stuck with him. His successful career as a barber actually began when he started cutting the hair of families at the orphanage. In 1943, Tony was drafted into the U.S. Army at the Presidio in Monterey and was sent to Fort Riley, Kansas. He served with the 21st Horse Cavalry Regiment during World War II.

After his discharge from the Army in 1946, Tony returned to the Inland area and found work at the Riverside Cement Plant until he was diagnosed with severe dust in his lungs in 1952. Subsequently, he attended a barber college in Los Angeles and returned to Riverside. However, being a "Hispanic barber" made it difficult to find work so he took a position in Barstow. Eventually, he returned to Riverside and found work in the Brockton Arcade and later joined Al Newman in what was then the new Riverside Plaza. In 1969, Tony opened his own business on the Tava Lanes property on Arlington Avenue and spent the next 41 years operating Tony's Personality Plus. He relocated to Brandi & Friends Salon in 2010 and continued to enjoy his work and loyal customers.

Tony is survived by his former wife Phyllis Estrada; daughter Marcella Traczyk; son David Estrada; daughter Patricia Stanley; son Tony Estrada Jr.; son Michael Estrada; son Edward Estrada; their spouses; eleven grandchildren; five great-grandchildren; two great-great-grandchildren; and a large extended family. Seaman, a 30-year-old resident of Murrieta and "decorated" Marine who was one of six United States Marines and two Nepalese soldiers that died when a Camp Pendleton-based helicopter crashed during an earthquake-relief mission in Nepal.

The crew of UH-1 Huey helicopter that Sergeant Seaman was on had been training in the Philippines in Operation Sahayogi Haat when they were deployed on a relief mission after a magnitude-7.8 earthquake hit Nepal on April 25, 2015. When a second magnitude-7.3 earthquake struck the country on May 12, 2015, their helicopter went missing while delivering rice and tarps in Charikot. It had dropped off supplies in one location and was enroute to a second site when contact was lost.

A great man and true hero, Sergeant Seaman loved his country and wanted to make a difference in the world. Enlisting in the military on March 3, 2009, he served as a UH-1Y helicopter crew chief with Marine Light Attack Helicopter Squadron 469. His deployments include 31st Marine Expeditionary Unit, Operation Enduring Freedom, and Operation Sahayogi Haat. His decorations include the Air Medal with Strike/Flight Numeral 5, Marine Corps Good Conduct Medal with bronze star in lieu of second award, Sea Service Deployment Ribbon with bronze star in lieu of second award, Afghanistan Campaign Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Navy Meritorious Unit Commendation, NATO Medal, and a Meritorious Mast.

Sergeant Seaman was a loving and devoted husband, father, and friend whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be dearly missed.
