BACKGROUND: Summary (continued)

Government Code Section 82011 identifies the Board of Supervisors for the County of Riverside as the code reviewing body for a local government agency within its county. A local government agency, as defined by Government Code Section 82041, includes Washington Charter School.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE OF THE WASHINGTON CHARTER SCHOOL

(Adopted January 15, 2015)

The Political Reform Act (Gov. Code § 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code Regs. § 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing Regulation 18730 may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This incorporation page, Regulation 18730 and the attached Appendix designating positions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code of the Washington Charter School ("WCS").

All officials and designated positions required to submit a statement of economic interests shall file their statements with the **Principal** as WCS's Filing Officer. The **Principal** shall make and retain a copy of all statements filed by the Members of the Governing Board and Principal and forward the originals of such statements to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside. The **Principal** shall retain the original statements filed by all other officials and designated positions and will make all retained statements available for public inspection and reproduction during regular business hours. (Gov. Code § 81008.)

PART "A"

All Officials who manage public investments, as defined by 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18701(b), are NOT subject to WCS's Code but must file disclosure statements under Government Code section 87200 et seq. [Regs. § 18730(b)(3)]

OFFICIALS WHO MANAGE PUBLIC INVESTMENTS

It has been determined that no positions at WCS are officials who manage public investments at this time.1

Individuals holding one of the above-listed positions may contact the Fair Political Practices Commission for assistance or written advice regarding their filing obligations if they believe that their position has been categorized incorrectly. The Fair Political Practices Commission makes the final determination whether a position is covered by § 87200

Consultants and New Positions²

Individuals serving as a consultant as defined in FPPC Reg 18701 or in a new position created since this Code was last approved that makes or participates in making decisions must file under the broadest disclosure set forth in this Code subject to the following limitation:

The principal may determine that, due to the range of duties or contractual obligations, it is more appropriate to assign a limited disclosure requirement. A clear explanation of the duties and a statement of the extent of the disclosure requirements must be in a written document. (Gov. Code. Sec. 82019, FPPC. Regulations. 18219 and 18734.) The principal's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this Conflict of Interest Code. (Gov. Code. Sec. 81008.)

PART "B"

DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

The disclosure categories listed below identify the types of economic interests that the designated position must disclose for each disclosure category to which he or she is assigned. ³ Such economic interests are reportable if they are either located in or doing business in the jurisdiction, are planning to do business in the jurisdiction, or have done business during the previous two years in the jurisdiction of WCS.

<u>Category 1:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that do business or own real property within the jurisdiction of WCS.

Category 2: All interests in real property which is located in whole or in part within, or not more than two (2) miles outside, the boundaries of WCS.

<u>Category 3:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that provide services, products, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type utilized by WCS.

<u>Category 4:</u> All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that provide services, products, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type utilized by the designated position's department, unit or division.

<u>Category 5</u>: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, if such entities or sources have filed claims against WCS in the past two years, or have a claim pending before WCS.

This Conflict of Interest Code does not require the reporting of gifts from outside this agency's jurisdiction if the source does not have some connection with or bearing upon the functions or duties of the position. (Reg. 18730,1)

RESOLUTION NO. 001

RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE WASHINGTON CHARTER SCHOOL TO ADOPT A CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE PURSUANT TO THE POLITICAL REFORM ACT OF 1974

WHEREAS, the State of California enacted the Political Reform Act of 1974. Government Code Section 81000 et seq. (the "Act"), which contains provisions relating to conflicts of interest which potentially affect all officers, employees and consultants of the Washington Charter School ("WCS") and requires all public agencies to adopt and promulgate a conflict of interest code; and

WHEREAS, the potential penalties for violation of the provisions of the Act are substantial and may include criminal and civil liability, as well as equitable relief which could result in WCS being restrained or prevented from acting in cases where the provisions of the Act may have been violated; and

WHEREAS, notice of the time and place of a public meeting on, and of consideration by the Governing Board, the proposed Code was provided each affected designated employee and publicly posted for review at the offices of Washington Charter School; and

WHEREAS, a public meeting was held upon the proposed Code at a regular meeting of the Governing Board on January 15, 2015, at which all present were given an opportunity to be heard on the proposed Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Board of the Washington Charter School that the Governing Board does hereby adopt the proposed Conflict

of Interest Code, a copy of which is attached hereto and shall be on file with the Principal and available to the public for inspection and copying during regular business hours;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Code shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside for approval and said Code shall become effective 30 days after the Board of Supervisors approves the proposed Code as submitted.
