BACKGROUND:

1. Friends of Riverside County Family Justice Center Foundation - \$13,000- The funding will be allocated for a forensic interview room in Southwest Riverside County for children and seniors who are victims of child or elder abuse. The interview room will have covert video equipment installed so a specially trained forensic interviewer from Child Protective will be able to interview the child victim while a law enforcement officer can monitor the interview from an adjacent room at the DA' investigator's offices. This effort will is to limit the traumatization of victims with the investigation and interview process.
2. Professional Women's Roundtable – \$1,000- provides scholarships for high-school graduates and women in the community for a college education.
3. Assistance League of Hemacinto- \$3,000- funding will be used for Operation School Bell which provides new clothing and shoes for low-income students who attend Hemet and San Jacinto school districts.
