

BACKGROUND:

1. Animal Friends of the Valley - \$1,000- the funding will provide food and shelter for animals.
2. Temecula Education Foundation - \$2,500 – The funding will expand the classroom grant program throughout Temecula School District. An example of classroom grants are: Cello and violin bows, owl pellets and common prey display for students at various schools.
3. Community Connect - \$2,500- provides support for 211 programs in Riverside County a 24 hour, 7 day a week assistance phone line. 211 list over 3000 resources to assist residents in finding help for critical human and health services.
4. Idyllwild Arts Foundation-\$2,500- the funding will provide scholarships to students in Southern California area to attend the Idyllwild Arts Summer Program.
