BACKGROUND: Summary

The Coachella Valley Housing Coalition (CVHC), a nonprofit public benefit corporation and affordable housing developer, desires to receive from the Housing Authority of the County of Riverside (HACR) 75 Project Based VASH Vouchers (PBV's) upon the execution of an Agreement to enter into Housing Assistance Payments, which will be submitted to the HACR's Board of Commissioners at a later date for review and approval. The HACR received the PBV's from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) through a competitive Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA). In its response to the NOFA, HACR pledged to use the 75 PBV's as a rental subsidy for homeless veterans referred by the Veterans Affairs Loma Linda upon completion of the 138 unit new construction complex located on March Air Reserve Base (housing project). The housing project will be located on the Southwest Corner of N Street and 6th Street, Moreno Valley, CA 92551, Assessor Parcel Numbers: 294-080-006, 007 and 008.

Since the 75 PBV's are derived from federal funds awarded by HUD, a federal agency, environmental review pursuant to National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) must be conducted. The County of Riverside Economic Development Agency (EDA) as the Responsible Entity for purposes of NEPA has completed the applicable environmental review procedures and has evaluated the potential effects of the issuance of the 75 PBV's as a rental subsidy (Project) on the environment and has found that there is no significant impact on the environment. HUD also requires that the recipient of federal funds complete and execute the attached Request for Release of Funds (RROF) certifying to agree and abide by special conditions, procedures and requirements of the environmental review. The federal funds provided by the HACR for the Project are strictly for a rental subsidy that will be utilized by CVHC upon project completion and do not involve any funds for the construction of the housing project. On June 12, 2015 the attached Notice to Public of a Finding of No Significant Impact on the Environment and Intent to Request a Release of Funds (Public Notice) was published in connection with the Project.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved as to form the attached RROF. Staff recommends that the Board of Supervisors approve the attached RROF.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

The March Veterans Village project will have a positive impact on citizens and businesses as it provides housing and supportive services for veterans as well as creates jobs for local residents.

11. Program Activity/Project Description

The Housing Authority of the County of Riverside is proposing to use 75 HUD VASH Project Based Vouchers for the March Veterans Village project located on March Air Reserve Base. The HACR staff will recommend to its Board of Commissioners that the HACR enter into an Agreement to enter into Housing Assistance Payments Contract with The Coachella Valley Housing Coalition (CVHC).

The proposed HUD VASH Project Based Vouchers will be used to provide a rental subsidy to Veterans residing at the March Veterans Village project. The March Veterans Village project is a new construction rental housing project that will consist of 138 units of which 116 are efficiency units, 6 are one-bedroom units and 16 are two-bedroom units. The apartment units will be rented to Veterans and their families whose incomes do not exceed 50% of the area median income for the County of Riverside.

These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the County of Riverside. Any individual, group or agency submitting comments should specify in their comments which "notice" their comments address.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about June 30, 2015, the County of Riverside will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Los Angeles Field Office for the release of HUD VASH Project Based Vouchers through the Housing Authority of the County of Riverside (HACR), to undertake the following project:

PROJECT NAME: March Veterans Village

PURPOSE: The project activity includes the allocation of 75 HUD-VASH Project Based Vouchers to be utilized by the Coachella Valley Housing Coalition, a non-profit public benefit corporation, to serve as a rental subsidy for March Veterans Village. March Veterans Village will consist of the construction of a 138-unit apartment complex for veterans located on March Air Reserve Base. The proposed project will consist of 116 efficiency units, 6 one-bedroom units and 16 two bedroom units. The efficiency units are approximately 382 square-feet, the one bedroom units are approximately 950 square feet and the two bedroom units are approximately 950 square feet in addition to the housing units the proposed project will consist of two tot-lots, an amphitheater, basketball cour, laundry facilities, barbeque areas, and a 3,000 square foot community room. The apartment units will be rented to low-income veterans and their families and provide the veteran(s) and their families a variety of supportive services designed to ease the transition back into civilian life.

LOCATION: The project site is comprised of 3 contiguous parcels totaling approximately 7.34 acres, located at 15305 6th Street, March Air Reserve Base, Moreno Valley, CA 92551, with the following Assessor Parcel Numbers:

294-080-006, 007, and 008

This activity may be undertaken over multiple years.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The County of Riverside has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Assessment (EA) on file at the Housing Authority of the County of Riverside at 5555 Arlington Avenue, Riverside, California 92504. The EA may be examined or copied between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except in the event of a holiday.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the EA and the Request for Release of Funds to the Riverside Economic Development Agency Housing Division, Attention Stephanie Adams at 555 Arlington Avenue, Riverside, California 92504. All comments received at the address specified above on or before June 29, 2015 will be considered by the County of Riverside prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing.

RELEASE OF FUNDS

The County of Riverside certifies to the HUD Los Angeles Field Office that Marion Ashley in his capacity as the Chairman of the County of Riverside Board of Supervisors consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's appro-

val of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the Housing Authority of the County of Riverside to allocate Project Based Vouchers for March Veterans Village on behalf of the County of Riverside.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of funds and the County of Riverside's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases:

a. the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the County of Riverside;
b. the County of Riverside has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58;
c. the grant recipient has committed funds or incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or
d. another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality.

Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to the HUD Los Angeles, Field Office at 611 W. 6th Street, Suite 800, Los Angeles, California 90017. Objections to the release of funds on a basis other than those stated above will not be considered by HUD.

Potential objectors should contact the HUD Environmental Officer, HUD Los Angeles Field Office (tel. 213-894-8000 or via fax 213-894-8122) to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
