BACKGROUND:

Summary

1. Debbie Chisholm Memorial Foundation will be hosting the fourth annual "Cops 4Kids With Cancer" fundraiser to benefit seriously ill children on September 26, 2015. This event will raise funds to assist sick and abused children through the various programs the foundation offers. CID funds will be used to provide a special Christmas for children with cancer.
2. The Joslyn Center is hosting the Active Aging Expo & Free Flu Shot Clinic in October 2015. Health care educators and vendors will attend the Expo to provide information, services, treatment, and flu shots to low income seniors in Indian Wells, Palm Desert, and Rancho Mirage. CID funding will be used to rent equipment such as tables, chairs, and tents.

3. The Palm Springs Air Museum sponsors a youth educational program that includes youth tours and summer camps at the museum. The goal of the program is to promote history, science, math, art, and patriotism to students from the Palm Springs and Desert Sands Unified School Districts. The program includes admission, STEM classroom time, a docent-led tour, lunch, a gift and busing to and from their respective schools. CID funding will be used for scholarships for students to attend the educational program.
4. St. Joan of Arc Catholic Church in Blythe will sponsor the Health, Safety and Education Day on October 9, 2015. This is a no-cost event for the residents of Blythe promoting health, safety, and education through different programs and community agencies. The CID funds will be used for the cost of advertising such as newspaper ads, printing flyers and banners.
5. The Southern California Energy plus Water Summit will be held September 30 and October 1, 2015 at the Palm Springs Convention Center. The Summit will feature three events: the Energy plus Water bus tour of Coachella Valley, the Green Consumer Expo and the Summit Conference. The conference will feature a full day of interactive educational sessions, keynote presentations and panel discussions. Scholarships to attend the conference are awarded to students from the Desert Mirage High School Green Academy, Desert Hot Springs Renewable Energy Academy of Learning, and Desert Smart Robotics Club as well as College students. The students will be able to demonstrate their work in exhibit booths, attend conference programs, and interact with speakers. CID funding will provide scholarships for approximately 100 students.
6. The Well in the Desert is a non-profit organization providing daily hot meals, emergency food assistance, weekly supplemental food distribution and various social services to western Coachella Valley. This is a vital service benefiting those affected by poverty including the homeless, senior citizens and the handicapped. CID funding will be used to continue the ongoing services.
