In 1984 he promoted to Division Chief supervising the Riverside County Fire Department's eastern division from Cabazon to Blythe. He promoted to Deputy Chief in 1990 and was responsible for fire department operations throughout the eastern half of Riverside County.

During his retirement, Eric taught fire technology courses at College of the Desert and served as the Fire Technology Coordinator in their Public Safety Department. He also worked for "Michelle's Fire Services" as the driver and operator of GIS Medical Units at large wildfire base camps. Later in life, he worked as an independent computer consultant and often refused payment.

Active in the community, Eric was a strong supporter of the Palm Desert Historical Society and served on the City of Palm Desert's Building Board of Appeals. He was also a member of the Palms to Pines Rotary Club and several multiple myeloma support groups.


