BACKGROUND: Summary (continued)

The funds are being allocated as a reward for providing information not already known to law enforcement and leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the break-in at the Riverside County Animal Shelter located at 6851 Van Buren Boulevard, Riverside, which ultimately caused the death of 4 dogs. The amount shall not exceed \$5,000 regardless of the number of eligible applicants seeking the reward. Any portion due to each applicant will be determined upon the recommendation of Riverside County law-enforcement officials to the Board of Supervisors, and will be based on the value of the information provided to investigators and/or prosecutors. This allocation will not be dispersed until all prosecutions in the case have been completed.

RESOLUTION NO. 2015-226

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE OFFERING A REWARD IN THE AMOUNT OF \$5,000 FOR NEW INFORMATION LEADING TO THE ARREST AND CONVICTION OF THE PERSON OR PERSONS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE BREAK-IN, AND DEATH OF 4 DOGS, AT RIVERSIDE COUNTY ANIMAL SHELTER-JURUPA VALLEY BETWEEN CLOSE OF BUSINESS SEPTEMBER 12, 2015 AND EARLY MORNING OF SEPTEMBER 13, 2015

WHEREAS, the County of Riverside may offer and pay rewards as authorized by the provisions of Section 53069.5 of the California Government Code; and

WHEREAS, between the evening of September 12, 2015 and the early morning of September 13, 2015, a person or persons broke into the Riverside County Animal Shelter located at 6851 Van Buren Boulevard, Riverside, CA 92509, and proceeded to break locks and release 22 dogs from their kennels, resulting in the death of four dogs as of this date; and

WHEREAS, Riverside County law enforcement has asked anyone with information to call investigators or go to their website to provide such information; and

WHEREAS, said acts are being investigated as an incidence of trespass and animal cruelty by Riverside County law enforcement officials;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, in regular session assembled on October 6, 2015, that a reward in the amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) is hereby approved and authorized for providing information not already known to law enforcement and leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the acts stated above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the amount of reward shall be up to Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) regardless of the number of eligible applicants seeking the reward, and any portion due to each applicant will be determined upon the recommendation of Riverside County law enforcement officials based upon the value of the information provided.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the offer of reward by the County shall terminate by payment, by revocation, or by withdrawal thereof by the County Board of Supervisors by resolution or motion and minute order adopted by majority vote of the full Board, or by expiration of the period of time set forth in the resolution offering the reward, or any extension thereof, which was approved by the Board of Supervisors while the offer was otherwise effective.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all decisions with respect to the relevance or materiality of information received, whether or not utilized in establishing the arrest and conviction of any one or more persons provides a basis for payment of an award, will be based on recommendations of Riverside County law enforcement officials, and are within the sole discretion of the Board of Supervisors.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all determinations affective, or dispositive, of the offer of reward, shall be within the sole discretion of the Board of Supervisors, and shall be final.
