BACKGROUND:

Summary

1. The City of Palm Springs will host the 19th Annual Palm Springs Veterans Day Parade on Nov. 11, 2015. This parade honors all who served, giving the community an opportunity to pay tribute to all our veterans. CID funds will be used towards the cost of the parade and post-parade concert production expenses.
2. The Riverside County Economic Development Agency will partner with The Community Foundation to create the 2015 Riverside County Indicators Report. This report provides a valuable tool to evaluate, target and address important issues in Riverside County annually. CID funds will be used towards the cost of producing the report.
3. C.V.S.P.I.N. will hold the annual Patriot Ride for Our Heroes in the Coachella Valley on Oct. 24, 2015. This is a charity cycling event that honors local military, firefighters, law enforcement and first responders while raising funds to benefit their respective local charities. CID funds will be used towards county costs such as route monitoring and law enforcement.
4. The Ranch Recovery Center is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing needed services to individuals and families who are seeking help from alcoholism and drug dependency. The partitions in the men's dorm bathroom are old, worn and need to be replaced. CID funding will be used towards this project.
5. The Riverside County Deputy District Attorney Association held a charity golf tournament on Oct. 5, 2015. All proceeds from this event will be donated to non-profit organizations and agencies dedicated to serving the children of Riverside County. CID funding will be used to help the children of Riverside County.
