BACKGROUND:

Summary

On September 12, 2015, the Valley Fire started in the County of Lake, California. The same day, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) approved emergency assistance through the Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG). The California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) enacted the Emergency Management Mutual Aid (EMMA) plan, and the County of Lake requested emergency management support from the County of Riverside.

BACKGROUND:

Summary (continued)

The MOA allows reimbursement of all reasonable costs associated with mutual aid assistance during the Valley Fire. The County of Riverside's Emergency Management Department (EMD) provided emergency management mutual aid consisting of emergency management personnel during the period of September 12, 2015 through October 3, 2015. Six staff spent a combined total of 48 days filling positions in the Lake County EOC.

Impact on Citizens and Businesses

This will benefit the residents and business of Riverside County by enhancing the County's emergency management preparation and response capabilities.

Additional Fiscal Information

The County of Riverside will be seeking approximately \$29,000 in reimbursement for costs for hotel, meals, fuel and overtime for the responding staff. The department will request Board approval should a budget adjustment be necessary.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) BETWEEN RIVERSIDE COUNTY AND THE COUNTY OF LAKE PERTAINING TO ASSISTANCE PROVIDED UNDER THE

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT MUTUAL AID (EMMA) PLAN

WHEREAS, this event and associated conditions will collectively be referred to as Valley fire; and

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2015, this declared emergency event consists of fire; and

WHEREAS, the following extreme heat conditions existed, unpredictable winds, low humidity and drought which aided the Valley Fire that swept through the Cobb/Middletown/Hidden Valley area of Lake County burning 76,067 acres threatening 2,953 homes, destroying 1,280 Single Residences, 27 Multiple Residences, 66 Nonresidential Commercial Properties, and 585 Other Minor Structures. Destroying power poles, public safety communications and telephone lines, and impacting 13 public water systems; and

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2015, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) approved emergency assistance through the Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Valley Fire (FEMA-5112-FM-CA); and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Management Mutual Aid Plan delineates the current state policy concerning Emergency Management Mutual Aid; and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Management Mutual Aid Plan describes the standard procedures used to acquire emergency management mutual aid resources and the method to ensure coordination of emergency management mutual aid planning and readiness; and

WHEREAS, the County Emergency Manager is the Operational Area Emergency Management Mutual Aid Coordinator; and

WHEREAS, Emergency Management Mutual Aid Plan provides, in pertinent part, "When an emergency develops or appears to be developing which cannot be resolved by emergency management resources within an Operational Area, it is the responsibility of the Operational Area Mutual Aid Coordinator to provide assistance and coordination to control the problem;" and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Management Mutual Aid Plan provides, in pertinent part, "A request for emergency management mutual aid requires the approval of an authorized official of the requesting jurisdiction;" and

WHEREAS, the County Emergency Manager of the County of Lake requested the mutual aid assistance of Riverside County, pursuant to the Emergency Management Mutual Aid Plan to provide emergency management support in connection with the Valley Fire; and

WHEREAS, Riverside County provided emergency management mutual aid consisting of emergency management personnel, equipment, and/or materials during the period September 13, 2015 through October 3, 2015 to assist with emergency management services in connection with the Valley Fire; and

WHEREAS, Riverside County agrees to document all of its mutual aid assistance costs related to the Valley Fire as attachments to this MOA and submit to the County of Lake as soon as practicable;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED by and between the County of Lake and Riverside County that the County of Lake may reimburse all reasonable costs associated with Riverside County emergency management mutual aid assistance during the Valley Fire.
