## SUBMITTAL TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE, STATE OF CALIFORNIA



BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to:

- 1. Habitat for Humanity Inland Valley- \$1,000 funding will be used to support home repairs for seniors and low income families in the First District.
- 2. Santa Rosa Plateau Nature Education Foundation \$1,500 funding will be used to support the "No Child Left Inside" Environment Education Program which teaches students about unique plants, animals and habitats at the Santa Rosa Plateau Ecological Reserve. Over 8,000 students from 10 school districts in grades 3-12 participate in this educational program.
- **3. Riverside Road Runners \$1,000** funding will be used to provide the youth running programs with equipment and scholarships for under-privileged youth to ensure that all students are able to participate in running programs.
