A "champion" for the military and law enforcement, Jeff pushed the City to create memorials for both, which are located outside of the Civic Center. He lobbied in Washington for monies for Beaumont to build projects and led the way in bringing Veterans assistance services to City Hall.

Jeff was a former Riverside County Sheriff's Deputy, U.S. Army Veteran, Charter Member of VFW Post 233, past President of Beaumont Youth Baseball, and a Planning Commissioner when he was elected to the Council in 2000. He was also involved in charity work including the Muscular Dystrophy Association.

Born on November 10, 1918 in Placentia, California, Rey moved to Corona in 1940 to work in the citrus industry. After leaving his job during a labor dispute, he was hired by Consolidated Vultee to fabricate B-24 bombers in San Diego. In 1944 he was drafted by the U.S. Air Corp and deployed to a fighter squadron at Glendale, California.

Following his honorable discharge in 1946, Rey returned to school, first earning his high school diploma and then a degree in Business Administration from Claremont Men's College in 1950. He received a Board of Accountancy Public Accountant License in 1951 and later obtained a Master's Degree in Education from Claremont Graduate School in 1968.

During his life, Rey operated a restaurant, an accounting service, was a radio deejay, and an educator. His prominent 29-year career in teaching began in 1950 at Lincoln Elementary School in Corona. He also taught at Corona Junior High and Corona Senior High Schools and some evening classes at Chaffey College prior to retiring in 1979.

An instrumental force in the community, Rey was presented the Lifetime Achievement Award by the Corona Chamber in 2013. He was one of the leaders that stopped the diabolical policy of segregation in Corona. When the existing American Legion Post would not allow the Military Veterans of Latino/Hispanic descent to join their unit, he was one of the founders of the Joe Dominguez American Legion Post #742. He was elected the first commander of the Post and that Legion Post still thrives today. He was also a charter member of Circle City Kiwanis for over 30 years, was a Parks and Recreation Commissioner for the City of Corona, and wrote articles for The Corona-Norco Independent local newspaper.

Rey was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and friend. His memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed but never forgotten.


