

RE: ASSEMBLY BILL 1238 - SUPPORT

Dear Assemblymember Linder:

Supervisor John F. Tavaglione, and I, Supervisor John J. Benoit, are pleased to support Assembly Bill 1238 (Linder) which will provide local agencies with the option to provide access to vital records through an electronic identification process.

Under existing law, each person that requests certified copies of vital records must sign a statement and present a notarized certificate of identity. The current process of document matching can be very time consuming for both the requestors and county staff.

The County of Riverside agrees that allowing electronic identification will make the online request process more efficient and reduce the additional costs associated with obtaining a notarized affidavit of identity. The option that AB 1238 creates will significantly reduce the amount of staff time needed to process vital records requests as well as reduce the overall cost born on the customer.
