He only lasted about an hour but enjoyed the experience and appreciated the gesture and novelty of likely being the oldest person there.

Throughout his long life, Roy worked as a bartender, served barbecue, worked in a lumber yard, packed fruit, and made moonshine and bootleg whiskey during the Prohibition. He also worked in construction driving trucks and tractors and paving roads.
