Once retired, they "escaped" to the Pacific Northwest, mainly Oregon and Washington, in their motorhome every summer for 17 years and volunteered as campground hosts. Edwards, an 85-year-old resident of Riverside, California and former General Manager and Chief Engineer of the Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District from 1978 through 1995 who passed away on February 4, 2016.

Born in Valparaiso, Indiana, Mr. Edwards graduated from Valparaiso University in 1952 with a Bachelor's Degree in Civil Engineering and proudly served in the U.S. Navy from 1952 to 1956. He received his Master's Degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Southern California in 1965 and a Master's Degree in Public Administration from USC in 1976. He worked for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in Los Angeles before joining the Flood Control District in 1962.

During Mr. Edwards' 34 years with the Flood Control District, the need for drainage infrastructure expanded along with Riverside County's substantial growth. Under his direction, the District constructed several hundred miles of open channels and underground storm drains as well as numerous levees, dams, and detention basins, with a cost of over \$220 million.

As Chief Engineer for 17 years, Mr. Edwards led his staff in their goal to spare Riverside County residents from the wreckage of uncontrolled flooding. An accomplished engineer and mentor, he was a strong leader who was highly respected by his peers. In recognition of his contribution to the District and residents, the Board of Supervisors in 1996 named the District headquarters in Riverside the Kenneth L. Edwards Flood Control Center in his honor.

Mr. Edwards is survived by his wife Marilyn, his daughter Cheryl, and his son Paul. He was a loving and devoted husband, father, and friend whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed but never forgotten.
