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BACKGROUND: Community Improvement Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

- 1. Riverside Area Rape Crisis Center \$2,500 funding will be used to support their efforts to provide direct services to victims of sexual assault and their families free of charge, prevention presentations across the full spectrum of the population, and will also assist Law Enforcement and the District Attorney's office by accompanying the Victim through judicial proceedings.
- 2. Assistance League of Temecula Valley \$2,500 funding will be used to support the Operation School Bell program. The program plans on clothing approximately 550 disadvantaged schoolchildren in the First District
