

BACKGROUND: Community Designation funds will be given to the following organizations:

1. Perris Union Management Association (PUMA)—annual donation will assist with college scholarships to students of the Perris Union High School district.
2. Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Inland Empire—annual funding will be used towards their one-on-one mentoring program. The program matches an adult mentor with an at-risk youth within the fifth district to promote healthy youth development by providing emotional, academic and social support.
3. Assistance League of Temecula Valley—annual funding will support Operation School Bell program which provides disadvantaged children grades K-12 within the Menifee Union School District and Romoland School District with new school-appropriate clothing and shoes.
