On motion of Supervisor Tavaglione, seconded by Supervisor Benoit, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, April 12, 2016, be adjourned in memory of Dr. Daniel Hays, a 97-year-old prominent resident of Riverside, California whose family owned and published The Press-Enterprise for decades.

Born on March 9, 1919 in Redding, Pennsylvania, Dr. Hays was a child when his family moved to Riverside. He graduated from Riverside Polytechnic High School in 1934 and received a degree in Biology from Stanford University in 1941. He attended Cornell University Medical College and served his internship at Boston Children's Hospital. From 1941 to 1947, he proudly served as a Captain in the U.S. Army Medical Corps and attended the Nuremburg trial of Hermann Goering, the head of the German Air Force.

In 1954, Dr. Hays moved to Los Angeles with his wife, Dr. Esther Fincher, and joined the staff at Good Samaritan Hospital and then Children's Hospital Los Angeles. Making his name in the area of childhood cancer management, he was instrumental in setting the standard for the specialty of modern pediatric cancer surgery. For his major contributions, the American Academy of Pediatrics honored him with the William E. Ladd Medal in 2004.

After his retirement in 1993, Dr. Hays returned to Riverside, where he founded and chaired "Victoria Avenue Without Wires." He secured private donations and national and state grants to move underground the utility lines that marred the view of Victoria Avenue. He was also involved in getting Victoria Avenue designated as a Historic District on the National Register of Historic Places.

Dr. Hays was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather, and friend whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed but never forgotten.

On motion of Supervisor Tavaglione, seconded by Supervisor Benoit, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, April 12, 2016, be adjourned in memory of Melville Hebbard MacArthur, DDS, a prominent resident of Riverside, California who passed away on April 4, 2016 and will always be remembered as a "self-made man and believer in the virtue that you can accomplish anything with hard work, persistence, and determination."

Born on September 10, 1914 in Davenport Center, New York, Dr. MacArthur came to Riverside, California as an orphan at the age of 16. He returned to New York and graduated from Hartwick College in Oneonta in 1936, with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Chemistry. After returning to California, he graduated from the University of Southern California School of Dentistry in 1940 and was the last surviving member of his class. During World II, he proudly served his country as a dentist in the United States Army for four years, on the island of Saipan, achieving the rank of Major.

From 1940 to 1987, Dr. MacArthur successfully practiced Dentistry in both Los Angeles and Riverside. He bought his first orange grove in Riverside in 1946 and continued to raise navel oranges on 60 acres in Riverside until his death. In 1963, he moved his family to Riverside and lived in the same house on Adams Street on a 10-acre orange grove until shortly before his death.

An inspirational force in the community for over 50 years, Dr. MacArthur was a former President of Magnolia Center Rotary Club and a Gage Canal Board Member for over 40 years. He was also a Board Member for the Salvation Army, a 4-H Leader, a dedicated volunteer for many local organizations, and a longtime member of Calvary Presbyterian Church. In 1985, he endowed a scholarship in honor of his mother, Mary Hebbard MacArthur, to assist children of farming families, to attend his alma mater, Hartwick College.

Dr. MacArthur was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, brother, and friend. His memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed but never forgotten.
