



Esmael came to the U.S. from Iran in 1974 to obtain an MBA at Chapman University, where he met the current university President Jim Doti and became one of his most “perceptive and gifted” researchers. He received his Master’s Degree in Economics from Cal State Fullerton and earned his Doctorate from Claremont Graduate University. He went on to become an Economics Professor at Chapman and Jim Doti’s closest friend. Together they wrote an econometrics textbook and ran the university’s economic forecasts.

As one of Chapman University’s most visible figures, Esmael was known as “the expert who made economic complexities comprehensible and even funny.” He was named a member of the California Treasurer’s Council of Economic Advisors and served on the Board of Directors for the school’s First Federal Credit Union, a not-for-profit banking service for teachers.

Within the university, Esmael had a “genius” for demystifying complex economic models in the classroom and mentored younger faculty members in his free time. His generosity with time and advice made him a “trusted voice” for businessmen, investors, and journalists. His name appears in more than 500 articles from Times archives, where his opinions narrated the California economy’s many ebbs and flows.

Esmael was a loving and devoted family man, mentor, and friend whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed but never forgotten.
